



Double Demerits for June Long Weekend

Temora Shire Council wishes to remind drivers and residents that double demerits will apply over the upcoming Queen's Birthday long weekend. The double demerit period will run from midnight Friday June 8 until midnight Monday June 11 for speeding, illegal use of a mobile phone, not wearing a seatbelt and motorcycle helmet offences. NSW Police and Temora Shire Council are asking drivers travelling over the holiday period to take care, plan their journeys, and watch their speed. Council Road Safety Officer, Michelle Doolan says "with the commencement of double demerits occurring on a school day, drivers should be attentive to posted speed limits." Speeding remains the biggest single road safety issue on NSW roads. Each year about 700,000 speeding offences are recorded across NSW, reflecting the high number of drivers who are prepared to break speed limits. Locally, speeding remains the greatest cause of death and injuries on our roads. Figures for the five year period 2012-2016 reveal speed attributed to 23.7 per cent of total crashes in the Temora Shire. Motorists should also be aware that almost 80 per cent of speed-related deaths on country roads happen on curves.

- Drive to the conditions in wet weather
- Remember snow a real possibility on state roads this coming long weekend
- Use vehicle lights during daylight hours to ensure high visibility in poor weather.

Owners of heritage buildings, or owners of buildings yet to be listed as heritage, are invited to apply for the 2018/2019 Heritage Assistance Funds. Projects involving the repair, maintenance or reinstatement of missing items on heritage buildings including fencing, verandahs, roof cladding, external painting, shopfront tiling and decorative detail, all qualify for the funds. In fact, anything from structural work through to final stage painting will be considered. The aim of the project is to encourage as much positive work on heritage items as possible. This program allows for joint funding of multiple projects or individual applications and will, hopefully, see a spike in the restoration and maintenance of our heritage listed buildings.



Inspiring author, Noel Braun, an advocate for suicide awareness and prevention, will speak about his book trilogy at Temora Town Library on Wednesday the 13th June from 2.30pm.

After the suicide of his wife, Maris, Noel embarked on a spiritual quest of self-discovery. At the age of 77 he decided to walk two of the more popular routes of the Camino de Santiago, a network of pilgrims' ways in France and Spain, which led him to write his first book *The Day Was Made for Walking*.

Two more Camino journeys followed, taking different routes. His most recent book *I Guess I'll Just Keep on Walking* is the sequel to his earlier book where the spiritual and physical merge with the ancient and the modern.

Last year at the age of 84, he embarked on a fifth journey, the subject perhaps of a future book.

New Development Contributions Plan

~ Fees and Examples ~

The Section 94A Developer Contributions Plan starts on 1 July. Any development applications lodged from 1 July will be subject to the contributions plan.

The fee schedule will be:

Proposed Cost of the Development	Maximum Percentage of the Levy
Up to \$100,000	Nil
\$100,001-\$200,000	0.25
\$200,001 +	0.5

Other local government sectors charge up to 1% on developments over \$200,001 and 0.5% on developments costing \$100,001 - \$200,000. This means Temora Shire is a very competitive area for developments of all sizes.

For example:

- The fee for a development worth \$150,000 will be \$375.
- A development valued at \$350,000 will be required to contribute \$1750.
- These fees are in addition to Council's Development Application fee.

Contributions will be used to assist Council in the delivery of community projects, within a shorter timeframe.

Did you know?

Are your animals registered and microchipped? It is a requirement in NSW for all cats and dogs to be microchipped and placed on the NSW Pet Registry by the age of 12 weeks, or prior to sale?



To update details, report missing pets, transfer ownership and pay most lifetime registration fees you need only visit the NSW Pet Registry Website www.petregistry.nsw.gov.au or visit Council office.

SENIORS WANTED

~ As AirBNB Hosts ~

The NSW Government has launched an Australian-first pilot program where NSW Seniors Card holders can receive a \$100 cash reward when they sign up as an Airbnb host and successfully complete their first booking of three nights or more.

"I encourage Temora seniors to consider opening their homes to this opportunity. It is a great way for older people to supplement their income and meet new people," Member for Cootamundra, Ms Steph Cooke said.

NSW Seniors Card holders will also be eligible for a \$20 Airbnb credit when they book as a guest

for the first time via the Airbnb website.

Minister for Ageing Tanya Davies said the partnership not only creates real economic opportunities for NSW seniors but also keeps them socially connected to their communities.

"This is about connecting seniors with like-minded people, offering cost effective ways to travel and new ways to keep the cost of living down," Mrs Davies said.

Airbnb Australia Country Manager Sam McDonagh said seniors are the hosts with the most.

"Older people are the most 'loved' or highest

rated hosts on Airbnb. With 85 per cent of these stays receiving five-star reviews, we want to encourage more seniors to turn their empty nests into income engines," Mr McDonagh said.

The success of the 6-month pilot program will be evaluated with a view to form a 12-month partnership that will offer further benefits to NSW Seniors Card holders.

The partnership supports the NSW Ageing Strategy 2016-2020 which identifies housing, social inclusion and travel as key priorities for seniors.
