

Flood Assistance Praise

While the damage bill from September's huge rain events and subsequent extensive flooding across the Shire is still being counted, the community spirit of those involved in assisting others has been praised.

Flooding to varying degrees was experienced in towns and rural areas throughout the Shire, with Council and emergency services called on to assist with flood rescues, property protection and numerous road closures.

Temora Mayor Rick Firman OAM praised the work of all involved in assisting their fellow residents.

Cr Firman extended the sincere thanks of the community to Temora SES Controller, Mrs Tennille West and her team, for the "exceptional work" they carried out in relation to the flooding.

"We as a Council and a community feel blessed to have such a dedicated and caring SES group. I feel it important to let them know how much we appreciate their efforts," Cr Firman said in the week following the deluge that saw up to 80mm of rainfall in less than 24 hours.

"Council also acknowledges our own staff, plus members of the Thanowring RFS, the Temora Fire and Rescue Brigade and other emergency service groups for their continuing support of Temora SES, in the flooding event," Cr Firman said.

Temora Council's Director of Engineering, Neil Ogilvie, also praised the efforts of the SES, Council staff and all involved in various ways to ensure the safety of residents.

"The efforts have been outstanding," he said. Damage to the road network throughout the Shire is significant, with an estimated \$5million in infrastructure damage and a possible

\$1million alone at the aerodrome.

Council will be eligible for flood funding relief through Natural Disaster Relief and Recovery Arrangements, a combination of State and Commonwealth funding assistance.

Mr Ogilvie said this will be imperative to assist with repairs to infrastructure, with the major focus being roads and damage at the Aerodrome.

"Runway 0523 has sustained significant damage to seal and pavement," he said.

"Once it is reopened, the load rating will be reduced.

"Specialist coring and inspections will be carried out to give us a clearer idea as to exactly what state the runway is in, and how much it will cost to repair."

Mr Ogilvie said Council was doing its best to reopen roads as they were declared safe, but some are expected to be closed to traffic for an extended period.

Updates are being made via Council's Facebook page and website.

"The situation is not going away quickly and it can be frustrating, but people do need to please be patient with road closures.

"This is an extraordinary event and we are certainly doing our best to deal with it."

"Road closure signs have been put there for a reason; drivers disobey those signs at their own risk," he warned.

Mr Ogilvie made special mention of Council staff that had assisted the SES during the worst of the flooding overnight to ensure the safety of residents, Mick Mannion, Alex Dahlenburg, James Durham, Kerry Wallace and Rob Fisher. "They did a fantastic job," Mr Ogilvie said.

TAIC Open Day Great Success

Temora Agricultural Innovation Centre (TAIC) was a hive of activity for its annual showcase – the FarmLink Open Day – on Friday, September 2. The wet weather which has dominated 2016 also impacted the Open Day, but the impressive facilities at TAIC meant that the original program could proceed.

Over 230 guests were accommodated in sheds and office facilities as they heard from a selection of 27 speakers across the six themes of Wheat, Canola, Soils, Drones, Livestock and Ladies' Agronomy Tour.

Sixteen trade stalls also set up undercover and were visited by farmers, ag industry professionals and students who took advantage of what was an outstanding learning and networking opportunity.

A number of FarmLink partnerships contributed to the day with Riverina LLS sponsoring the morning tea and hosting the Drones in Agriculture theme, AWB hosting the Canola theme, Commonwealth Bank providing complimentary refreshments over lunch and AGT hosting the cut-out at the end of the day.

Donations were also made to St Anne's Central School who served the barbecue lunch which had been cooked by Hutcheon and Pearce staff, and Temora Public School who partnered with Temora Ag Bureau to assist in setting up the day.

RFS Championships 2018

Temora Shire has been granted the hosting rights for the 2018 NSW Rural Fire Service State Championships.

Earlier this year NSW RFS Bland Temora District, in conjunction with Temora Shire Council, submitted an Expression of Interest to host the event in Temora. Following a comprehensive review of the proposal, the Bland Temora District was announced as the 2018 host during the 2016 State Championships in Narrabri.

The State Championships take place every two years and bring together around 500 NSW RFS members from brigades across NSW to compete in a range of challenging, real life scenarios including bush, grass and structural firefighting, motor vehicle accident and navigation. The focus of these realistic scenarios is to test leadership, teamwork and core skills.

Featuring a fully functional Incident Management Team, base camp, catering, aviation and specialist chainsaw operators, the Championships also

provides a valuable opportunity to field test the Service's evolving communication technologies and command and control structures.

Mayor Rick Firman said Temora Shire is thrilled to be hosting the event.

"We are excited to have been given the hosting rights for 2018 NSW RFS State Championships.

"Temora Shire Council and the community are looking forward to embracing and supporting this unique event," he said.

The event also contributes significantly to the local host community and will provide substantial stimulation to the local economy. Event organisers will endeavour to preference local suppliers where possible, particularly with catering, equipment hire and accommodation.

Council is looking forward to showcasing some of Temora Shire's unique assets during the championships and will be working with RFS event staff to ensure that the event is one to remember for participants and spectators alike.

Set in a fictional town in inland Australia, Carpe Diem portrays the friendship of Nev, a hard-working farmer, and John his stock agent friend. Both have been impacted by the long-running drought and suffering their own personal crisis.

Leading actor John Wood, said: "It's a very Australian thing (not just male, necessarily) to feel that it's none of our business and that someone knows what they're doing. But men need to ask the questions and not ignore their apparent depression or inner pain."

The free community event is presented by the Rural Adversity Mental Health Program (RAMHP) and MLHD in partnership with playwright Megan Rigoni of Centre Stage Scripts.


The Bald Archy provides artists of all styles and standards with an opportunity to create portrait paintings of humour, dark satire, light comedy or caricature.
