PRIMARY PRODUCER HEAVY VEHICLE REFUNDS AND REGISTRATION REBATE

FARMERS across the state will benefit from a rebate on heavy vehicle registration costs for the next two years. The rebate will apply to all primary producers who register or renew their heavy vehicle from 1 July 2018 up to 30 June 2020.

Primary Producers may also be able to claim a refund on some past heavy vehicle registration charges paid from 1 July 2015 to 30 June 2018. Eligible primary producers will be contacted by mail and notified of the process to claim their refund. It will not be necessary to attend a Service

NSW centre as all transactions will be done over the phone for eligible customers.

All primary producers who register a heavy vehicle from 1st November will automatically receive a rebate at the time of the registration when paying online or in person.

The rebate will cover some registration costs, but does not include:

Compulsory third party insurance, heavy vehicle inspection fees, stamp duty, number plate fee.

Rural's \$300 Acquisitive Prize for a rural theme, J & J Cornford \$300 Acquisitive Prize for a water colour, and the Mayor's \$300 Acquisitive Prize for an artist under 25.

There are a number of other categories for different mediums, age and ability to be awarded at the opening including the \$1000 open prize.

The exhibition will run for a month at the Bundawarrah Centre until November 2nd. The Bundawarrah Centre is open daily from 9.30am – 4pm.

Sebastopol Solar Farm - Update

SINCE ib vogt's 2nd Community Open Day in May, the footprint of the proposal has been revised to reduce potential visual impacts. The capacity of the project has been reduced to 108 MW (DC), which would generate enough renewable electricity to supply power to approximately 40,000 households (assuming average household consumption of 5,920 kWh p.a.).

In addition to the local economic benefits of the solar farm, ib vogt has sponsored a number of local community initiatives. The developer is keeping a register of local contractors and businesses interested in working

for the solar farm - please email info@sebastopolsolarfarm.com.au to register.

The potential environmental impacts of the proposal have been assessed and reported in an Environmental Impact Statement. The Development Application for the solar farm was submitted in September 2018 and the NSW Department of Planning and Environment will advertise the public exhibition period for the EIS. The documents will be available for a minimum 28 days:

- in hard copy at Temora & Junee Shire Council Chambers
- on the Department's Major

If approved, Development Approval is anticipated in late 2018 and construction of the solar farm would commence in mid-2019.
