A FACELIFT FOR THE TOWN HALL

A public Q&A session was held in August for residents to share their ideas for the proposed \$1 Million upgrade of the Town Hall Precinct.

Architect, David Scobie, and Audio Visual Consultant, Adam Bannister, joined Director of Environmental Services, Kris Dunstan, in a public forum to discuss the proposed refurbishment of the acoustics, stage lighting, sound system, accessible bathrooms and entry way, as well as a facelift for the exterior of the building, which has remained virtually unchanged since 1963.

The upgrade will include new stage curtains as well as an audio visual advancement that will be both up to industry standard, and very user friendly. The main auditorium will receive a freshen up and be dressed with adjustable sound proofing curtains to optimise the natural acoustics of the building and the asbestos ceiling will be replaced.

The inclusion of two projectors and large retractable screens will excite people looking for a larger space to hold

functions, conferences and screenings.

"There's an unmet market, at the moment, for a large function space that is versatile and attractive. We're hoping to close the niche on that market" said Mr Dunstan.

The exterior of the structure will change quite dramatically to include accessible public toilets, accessible entry way with automatic doors and ramp, a beautiful deck area and a large and welcoming foyer to enjoy a glass of bubbly in before catching a show.

It is proposed that the works might begin in November with the removal of the current asbestos-filled ceiling. Mr Dunstan explained to the attendees of the meeting that council hope to have all the works completed by May 2019, with as minimal disruption to the community as possible.

"Obviously it would be ideal if we didn't have to shut down the cinema or Town Hall for any length of time, but it's likely to disrupt normal proceedings a little bit. It will be worth it, though!" he said.

Pool Safety Spring Clean

~ Spring cleaning isn't just limited to the inside of your home -

Here are some helpful pool safety checks to include on your to-do list:

- Does the pool have a barrier that complies with the Australian Standard 1926.1-1993/2012?
*To obtain a copy of this standard please contact Council and we will be happy to assist.
- Is the pool barrier well maintained and in a good state of repair as an effective and safe barrier?
- Does the gate swing freely, close and latch by itself from any open position?
- Is there an appropriate resuscitation (CPR) sign in the immediate vicinity of the pool area?
- Is the resuscitation sign easily readable, do you require a new one?
- Is your pool fence clear of any objects such as BBQs, trees, rocks, shrubs, garden items and deckchairs that could assist someone to climb over the fence?

Please Note: the non-climb zone is measured from the top of the horizontal and should be clear of any object at least by 900mm

- Is your current first aid certificate valid, do you need to schedule in some training for first aid?

The above checklist is to be used as a guide only. Should you require further information or assistance in assessing the compliant nature of your swimming pool please contact Council and to arrange an inspection. This service requires a \$70 fee.

Council reminds residents that there is no better prevention of swimming pool drownings than direct supervision.

Please ensure that your children, or those that are not confident in the water, are always supervised.

Resuscitation Charts are available for purchase from Council at a cost of \$25.

CLEAR DEBRIS AS PART OF YOUR SPRING CLEAN

Coming in to the warmer months it is important to assess and rectify possible dangers in your yard and property.

Start now! Your property upkeep is your responsibility.

Include the outside yard or entirety of your block in your spring cleaning schedule.

You, as the registered owner, will need to ensure that all lots are maintained in a clean and tidy condition, free from accumulations of rubbish or waste material.

If the grass exceeds forty centimetres (40cm) in length Council are entitled to issue a

notice to the registered proprietor to cut the grass.

Council may engage its employees or contractors to enter the property to cut the grass and to remove all waste material at the cost of the registered proprietor if they do not comply.

FOCUSING ON FATIGUE



We all have busy lifestyles and tiredness seems to be an everyday occurrence, but Council's Road Safety Officer advises "many drivers aren't aware how being tired can affect their driving, and most don't realise just how dangerous it is when we are tired behind the wheel".

"Being awake for around 17 hours has a similar effect on your driving ability as having a blood alcohol content of 0.05 – so it's just like being over the limit".

By following the following tips motorists can minimise the risks of suffering from driver fatigue and keep safe on our country roads:

- Don't drive when you would normally be asleep
- Avoid starting long drives after work
- Take regular breaks from driving
- Share the driving whenever possible
- Pull over and stop when you feel drowsy, uncomfortable or start to lose concentration
- Ask your doctor or pharmacist about whether any medication you may be taking will affect your driving ability.
