Official Opening at Medical Precinct

The final stage of Temora's new medical precinct, in Hoskins Street, will be officially opened on Saturday, 4 February. The construction of a medical imaging facility and three residential units completes an outstanding and comprehensive medical complex for Temora and district. Mayor Rick Firman OAM is delighted at the level of medical services the town now has. "This is the final stage to Council's dream of providing the best medical services we can for our Shire community, it is a very exciting development," he said. Cr Firman extended sincere thanks to all who have played a role in the various stages of the development. "We are particularly grateful to the Federal Government, and the support of Member for Riverina, Michael McCormack, for close to \$600,000 in funding under the National Stronger Regions Fund, and also to the NSW Member for Cootamundra, the Hon. Katrina Hodgkinson and the State Government for \$50,000 towards the project." Mr McCormack will officially open the Medical Precinct, together with Ms. Hodgkinson. "The community has been very supportive and we invite everyone to come to the opening and celebrate this result," Cr Firman said. "Council are proud that local tradesmen, under the guidance of our Project Manager, James Durham – all did an exceptional job". This special community event will include a tour of the facilities and lunch. The program gets underway from 12.30pm.

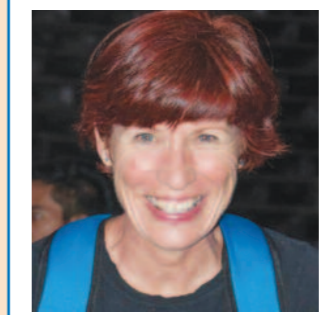
Celebrate Australia Day in Temora Shire

Viv was born in South Africa, and immigrated to Australia in 2002. She has a strong passion for running, having organised informal running groups in various places she has lived, and also competing in many events. This included proudly representing Australia in the women's 100km running team in 2006, 2007 and 2008.

Viv says "a pair of shoes can change a life! They can give hope, self-worth and dignity, and the courage to step outside with pride and confidence. Shoes can improve both the mental and physical health of each and every soul."

A visit to South Africa to run the Comrades Marathon took her to the front row of poverty. A vision for the future became clear and exciting – getting shoes onto bare feet across the planet, and in 2009 the charity "Shoes for Planet Earth" was formed.

They then "looked local" to see if there was a need for shoes amongst the needy and homeless in

Sydney and throughout Australia, and to date have:
 *Changed over 37,000 lives through the gift of a pair of shoes.
 *Given shoes to the homeless, indigenous sporting communities, natural disaster victims, orphans, church groups and people in need.
 *Sent shoes to eleven countries other than Australia and growing.
 *Started a weekly walking group for Sydney's homeless.
 "There are not enough hours in a day to answer all life's calls, but running keeps me sane, fit and healthy so that I can continue to do the work that God has put me here to do," said Viv.

Exhibition of Planning Proposal Large Lot Residential Temora

Currently on public exhibition is a draft amendment to the Temora Local Environmental Plan, to reduce the minimum lot size of land located in the Bundawarrah Road estate and the Rosella Street estate.

This amendment, if adopted by Council and NSW Planning and Environment, will reduce the area of land required for a dwelling in these two estates from two hectares, to one hectare.

This will give landowners the option to subdivide their land, subject to Council approval.

Council's Town Planner, Claire Golder said, "Temora Shire Council officers have become aware of a shortage of vacant large lot residential blocks in Temora. This amendment is intended to assist with addressing this shortage."

"There has been recent population growth in Temora Shire and Council is actively promoting Temora as a lifestyle choice for relocating families.

"Council wishes to encourage the efficient use of its rural residential land, as Council acknowledges that this type of land is in limited supply, due to zoning.

"By reducing the minimum lot size to one hectare, this assists with managing the cost of servicing this land, whilst still achieving the low density that is desired by these landowners.

"Overall land maintenance requirements will be reduced through a decrease in minimum lot size. This is seen as a significant benefit as some landowners can find that maintaining their large lot takes up much of their spare time.

"It is important to know that any future subdivision of land will be the choice and responsibility of the land owner. Landowners will not be required to subdivide their land if they do not wish to do so.

"The subject land is intended to be supported by a Development Control Plan in order to manage issues that would be of concern to landowners, including separation of dwellings, access and privacy.

"Council is working on completing the Development Control Plan at the moment and this will also be publicly exhibited in the near future."

The exhibition closes on 24 January 2017, with written submissions to be addressed to the General Manager, either by mail, email or hand delivered to Council's offices.

Registration Renewal - Changes for Pensioners

If you are a pension concession card holder and receive free vehicle registration, your vehicle's registration may be eligible for automatic renewal.

Once you have your vehicle inspected (if required) and obtain Compulsory Third Party insurance, Roads and Maritime will automatically renew your vehicle's registration, as long as you meet the eligibility criteria.

TAIC Planning for 2017

A new year at Temora Agricultural Innovation Centre ... and the planning has begun!

Sorting out paddock plans for the cropping season is a priority, balancing the requests of trial users, project needs, commercial crop production and the integration of livestock on the 600 hectare property.

Looking at proactively managing the impact of weeds, FarmLink is embarking on two projects to address weed control.

The first is in conjunction with Riverina Local Land Services looking at stubble cover, spraying and sheep grazing as a part of an initiative to help farmers adapt to climate variability.

The second is a part of the GRDC Stubble Initiative and will involve a demonstration day at TAIC in early February looking at spray efficacy in different stubble treatments. Further details on the day can be found via the FarmLink website www.farmlink.com.au as they become available.

Meanwhile, the Meat and Livestock Australia (MLA) Satellite Flock Project is nearing another key stage, with artificial insemination of the ewes to take place at the end of January.
