They also have a lot more freedom to pursue their passions of aviation and antique motor cars and are both heavily involved in Temora Flyers Inc. (TFI) and the Temora Antique Motor Club.

"We've organised overnight trips for the Motor Club and host a Christmas party every year in our hangar. "Our hangar is known as the 'Party Palace'. We have a pool table, pizza oven, large TV and even a disco ball. We love entertaining at home," Gareth says.

They both agree that the facilities in Temora are fantastic, but say it did take them a while to get used to shops closing up early on weekends. They support the town by shopping locally and have seen a lot of new businesses spring up in the last six years.

"To see constant growth in a little town gives you a good feeling and you know you've made the right decision," Gareth says.

They're involvement with TFI has allowed them to give back to the community, by raising money for local charities. They are both helping to organise future TFI events and hope to get more people involved in aviation.
