RESETTLEMENT PROGRAM COMMITTEE MEET

MEMBERS from the newly formed Resettlement Committee attended the Pathways to Employment Expo in Cabramatta in May.

This was the first step in reaching out to migrant communities as potential future residents of our Shire.

At the first meeting of the committee, held in early May, there was significant discussion acknowledging concerns raised by members of the public.

"We really are in the very early stages of the program," said Council's Economic Development Manager,

Mr Craig Sinclair.

"We are interested in hearing from the community about concerns or ideas, as all feedback can help us in this pilot program."

Temora Shire was selected to participate in this trial after being recognised as a leader in attracting new residents.

The Resettlement program will run in a very similar manner to the Country Change program which has seen a number of new residents join the community. Similar to Country Change, this program will be looking at the possible

relocation of between three to five families.

"We're not talking about a large number of people," said Mr Sinclair.

"We acknowledge that the Temora community has strong values and we will be looking for people who are a good fit for our community.

"We are also partnering with local employers who have vacancies they have struggled to fill. So the new residents will arrive to Temora with the security of a job and will contribute to our economy from day one," he concluded.

Who is a refugee?

Road Works Safety

IT can be frustrating to encounter road works, particularly when you have to slow down or stop. You may wonder why you need to slow down at all.

In March, 2018, a Traffic Controller in Cowra was operating the stop/slow bat at scheduled road works when a vehicle approached at high speed.

The vehicle skidded on the sealed surface for approximately 70 metres striking the stop/ slow bat as the Traffic Controller

was moving away from the path of the vehicle.

Although not physically injured, the near miss understandably upset the Traffic Controller and his colleagues.

When approaching road works, be aware that you are entering the office of the workers and proceeding at the signposted speed is not only the law, but a safety precaution.

UPDATING YOUR PET'S DETAILS ON THE NSW COMPANION ANIMALS REGISTER

IT is a requirement in NSW for all cats and dogs to be microchipped and placed on the NSW Pet Registry by the time they reach 12 weeks of age, or prior to sale, whichever comes first.

If it's not already done prior to collecting your pet from the breeder or previous owner, you can microchip your pet at the local vets where they'll insert the tiny microchip into the back of your pet's neck and add your pet's details to the registry.

Once that is done you can log on to the registry, make a profile and 'claim' your pet in the database by searching for the microchip number and your contact details.

De-sexed pets are registered at a discounted rate.

The NSW Pet Registry enables lost pets to be reunited with their owners and is now available for cat and dog owners to:

- create an owner profile,
- update their contact details,
- transfer ownership of pets
- report their pet missing, and,
- pay most lifetime registration fees online.

The Pet Registry will also be used by pet breeders, vets and authorised identifiers.

Pet breeders, who create a profile on the Pet Register, will be able to

have their new litters added straight to their profile.

Veterinarians and authorised identifiers are able to enter a pet's details directly onto the Pet Registry as part of their microchipping service, reducing errors and making data entry more efficient.

For the time being, paper forms are still available for those who cannot use the Pet Registry, but this is being phased out.

People with assistance and working dogs will also need to register their dog in person at their local council.

Textiles & Fibre Exhibition

SOUTHERN LIGHTS

THE Southern Lights project will see one of the largest deployments of smart-enabled LED lighting in Australia, with over 75,000 LED streetlights installed across a geographical area that is the same size as the United Kingdom.

The benefits from the project include 'smart controls technology' which can dramatically improve service levels and offer a wide range of operating regimes not currently possible, including dimming during off-peak, raising lighting levels during peak times, optimising lighting levels, facilitating automated population of asset registers and improving the accuracy of billing.

The street lighting controlled networks are also being increasingly recognised as the likely backbone of smart city deployments as, once installed, they are able to support a range of other devices in the public domain at low marginal cost.

Some of the capabilities for future use of the technology include: wifi; app based wireless control; environmental sensing (air quality, noise etc); water level/ flood monitoring; concealed speakers (music, alerts); push to talk service; e-vehicle bike charging; image sensing (security, statistics); and more.

The project partners, including REROC, are working very closely with Essential Energy who are pivotal to the

successful delivery of the project in our region. Consultants are currently working with Essential Energy to prepare the business cases which will determine the return on investment and the savings for participating councils.

Business cases are being prepared for all 42 participating councils as well as one for the overall project. Once the business cases are complete a series of workshops will be held between councils and the State Government to brief them on the outcomes.

The Southern Lights group is looking at possible funding options for the project and is hopeful that the State Government will provide funding assistance.

Healthy Hospitality

THE Temora Youth Hospitality Teams have recently implemented a Healthy Food Policy as part of the Youth Development Action Plan.

The policy enables education, modelling and development of health outcomes for young people as outlined in the Youth Development Action Plan.

The policy encourages the inclusion of fresh fruit and vegetables in recipes and platters,

and limits the use of refined sugar and processed foods.

The Hospitality Teams will use recipes that ensure a wide variety of nutritional experiences are offered. They will receive education around the long term benefits of including these foods in their diets.

"We are focusing on cooking from scratch which will eliminate the need for pre-packaged and processed foods," said Youth

Officer, Kim Sandgren. "Cooking from scratch gives the young people more control over ingredients and equips them for a lifetime of cooking skills".

"There will still be opportunities to have treats," Ms Sandgren said. "The young people will learn how to make homemade treats and will be given the chance to find alternatives to refined sugar where possible. It's all about education," she concluded.
