

Wood Collection



There are Council rules to be abided by when collecting firewood.

ALTHOUGH the winter months are now behind us, Council would like to remind residents of the rules around firewood collection

- Council do not issue wood permits
- It is not permissible to remove firewood from a Council road reserve
- Council will not give permission to anyone to remove timber with the exception of suitably qualified

contractors to remove trees considered to be dangerous by Council or that are required to be removed for roadwork purposes

 It is an offence to impede traffic flow, fell timber, remove burls or any part of standing timber

 It is an offence under the Local Government Act 1993 where a person who, without lawful excuse, wilfully

or negligently injures, damages or unnecessarily disturbs any plant, animals. rock or soil in a public place

If a resident witnesses an instance of unauthorised tree removal, damage or pruning of trees on Council land, please contact Council's **Environmental Services** Department on 6980 1100. Council Officers will then investigate.

Cash Splash

RESIDENTS are being asked to help Council make the decision on how to spend the \$778.000 allocated to projects within the Shire as part of Round 3 of the Stronger Country Communities Fund.

There are several projects that Council has identified as possible candidates but not all projects are able to be funded.

The list of possible projects aligns with Council's Community Strategic Plan which was developed in consultation with resi-

Each project must have a minimum cost of \$50,000 and cannot include maintenance or construction of local roads and other core service infrastructure such as drainage and sewer

Two other projects, an upgrade of Temora's swimming pool and construction of the new Ambulance Museum at the Rundawarrah Centre, are not being considered as both of these projects have budget estimates exceeding the total funds allocated to Temora Shire.

NOW that we can expect some warmer weather, it is the ideal time to take your pooch out to the purpose built off leash dog park located off Research Station Road at Lake Centenery.


The fully fenced area is equipped with obstacles and activities designed to keep
