Doing our bit

IN response to an overwhelming amount of correspondence regarding the drought and its effect on Temora Shire residents, Councilors and senior staff recently discussed ways in which Council can realistically assist our affected residents

"Councilors Judd and McLaren recently gave me a tour of some of the farms on our northern and westerly sides", said

Mayor, Rick Firman, "It was an eye-opener to say the least. After meeting with the Council Executive it is our firm view that the waiving of rates is not a realistic or financially responsible option for Council and our community".

It was proposed that Council provide support for those residents who have been negatively impacted by the drought in the following ways:

- Easing the burden by deferring recovery action against drought affected residents.

- Waiving the interest

DROUGHT ASSISTANCE FOR TEMORA SHIRE

THE NSW Government has committed over \$1.8 billion to drought relief in NSW and Temora Shire residents can now benefit from these funds. Residents can check their eligibility by viewing the criteria, guidelines and FAQs on the Drought Hub website under "Available Drought Assistance in NSW,

There are numerous categories to benefit those in the agricultural and business communities:

Drought Assistance Fund

The NSW Government is offering a \$50,000 interest-free loan to transport stock, fodder water, genetic and banking of breeding herds and installing on-farm fodder and water infrastructure. The term of the loan is seven years and there are no repayments required in the first two years.

Farm Innovation Fund The NSW Government is offering a loan scheme for

Animal Welfare Transport Subsidy


