COVID-19 Vaccine Rolled Out

THE COVID-19 vaccination program commenced in NSW on 22 February 2021 with those at highest risk of exposure to the COVID-19 virus, or of severe disease, receiving the first doses of the vaccine. This includes our healthcare workers, quarantine and border staff, as well as aged and disability care staff and residents.

In NSW, the first phase of vaccinations was administered through three initial vaccination hubs at Westmead, Liverpool and Royal Prince Alfred Hospitals to 35,000 at risk workers over a three-week period. Since 10 March 2021, additional vaccination hubs and clinics have begun to open to support the roll-out of the vaccination program – including Wagga.

The vaccine will be progressively made available to other Australian residents in priority phases.

Whilst the vaccine is voluntary, the NSW Chief Health Officer, Dr Kerry Grant, is encouraging all Australians to get vaccinated.

“The vaccines, together with continuing to practice COVID safe behaviours are the best ways to protect your family, friends and community,” he said.

Have you got room to spare?

WITH a number of significantly large infrastructure projects taking off in our Shire at the moment, there is an increased need for furnished accommodation for workers.

We are looking to facilitate residents who would like to rent a furnished room in their home or a granny flat to temporary workers.

“There are a significant number of temporary workers seeking furnished accommodation for their short-term stay in the Temora Shire whilst they work on infrastructure projects such as the Sebastopol Solar Farm,” said Council’s Economic Development Manager, Craig Sinclair.

“These workers are employed six (6) days a week and primarily need a place to lay their head for 3 – 4 months.”

Accommodation solutions are required immediately and residents who are able to help are urged to contact Ann Pike at the Visitor Information Centre.

“Ann’s role will be to create a register of available spaces and then to connect landlords with potential lodgers.

“Landlords will be responsible for ensuring the legalities of letting a space are in place and negotiating terms and conditions directly with the lodgers,” said Mr Sinclair.

Nominations for potential candidates will open in late June and must be done through the NSW Electoral Commission’s website.

“It’s very important that those running for election understand the process and responsibilities involved. This workshop will make the procedure clearer” said Mr Lavelle.

Anyone interested in running as a candidate in the upcoming election, or wanting to learn more about the process, is urged to attend.

“This serves also as a timely reminder for residents to check their enrolment status. All Australian residents over the age of 18 are required by law to vote,” Mr Lavelle said.

## Primary Producer Rego Concessions

FROM February 4th, 2021, eligible primary producers must provide the following to be granted a primary producer concession when establishing, transferring or changing the usage on a vehicle registration:

- Declaration of Eligibility for a Registration Concession **AND ONE OF THE FOLLOWING:**
- A declaration signed by a registered tax agent or accountant stating the

applicant is a primary producer as defined by the Motor Vehicles Taxation Act 1988 **OR**

• A Tax Averaging Certificate or a Tax Assessment Notice from the Australian Taxation Office (not more than 2 years old) **OR**

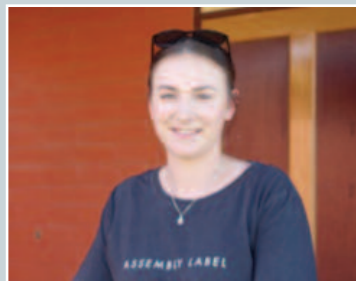
• A letter from the Australian Taxation Office confirming the applicant is registered as a primary producer (not more than

one year old).

**Note:**

- Heavy Vehicles have different eligibility requirements until 30 June 2021.
- Primary producer vehicles are **not**:
- Used for let (leased)
- Used for hire (rented)
- Used to receive a fee or reward (including a fee or reward from another primary producer).

"The two-day YOUTH-Made Market will launch this month at the old Target building on Friday 16th and Saturday 17th April," she said.

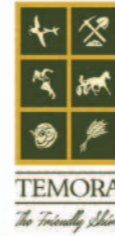
"The program has connected our local business community with young entrepreneurs and the results are very exciting.

Start right here in Temora where you can explore the history of the

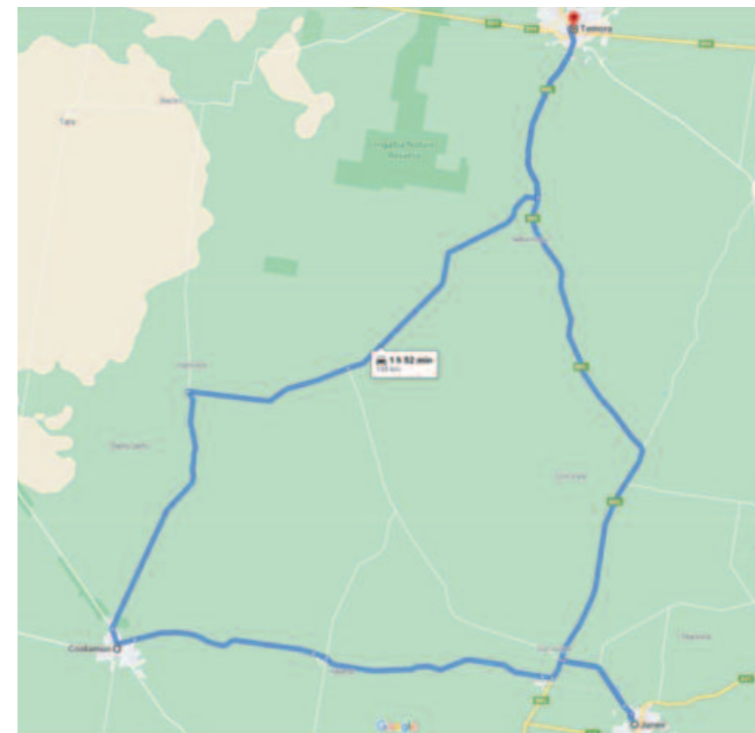

## BE BUS AWARE

Buses can't stop quickly

We all have a part to play in keeping our children safe when crossing the road, including on and around buses. School aged children might seem independent, but they still need a hand.

- Remember:
- Teach your child to stand back from the kerb when waiting for a bus
  - Always meet your children AT school or the bus stop and NEVER wait on the opposite side of the road and call them across
  - Always supervise your child and hold

their hand when walking to and from the bus stop and when crossing the road until they are at least 10

- Wait until the bus has gone then use a safe place to cross the road.

As pedestrians your children are vulnerable around roads, buses, and other traffic. Teach your children to avoid distractions when crossing the road and around traffic. We know that because of their sheer size and mass, buses cause severe outcomes for other road

users in crashes. Buses cannot stop quickly, and as a driver you should always:

- Give way to buses
- Not merge too closely in front of buses
- Keep a safe distance from buses in front of you
- Slow down to 40 km/h when bus lights are flashing

As a motorbike rider or cyclist, you need to be aware that buses have blind spots, so avoid passing or overtaking a bus when it is turning. Follow the road rules and ride with care.
