

COVID Check in Card

SERVICE NSW recognised that the QR check-in system may not be accessible for everyone and has developed the Covid check-in card to assist people in following Covid check-in rules.

The Covid check-in card is a hard copy card with an encrypted, unique QR code that contains the customer's registered contact details.

When you enter a COVID Safe business, a staff member scans your card and your visit to the premises is electronically recorded. If the business device is unable to read your QR code, the staff member will enter your details manually into the online webform.

The card provides an

alternative check-in method for customers who don't have smart phones and/or those who are not comfortable using the Service NSW webform.

To get a Covid check-in card, simply follow these simple steps:

1. go to the Service NSW website and search "check-in cards"
2. select the option to apply online
3. follow the prompts to add your first and last names and a contact phone number.

You can opt to have the card posted to you or you can print it off at home.

Unfortunately, this process cannot be done at the Temora Service NSW Agency.

"None of us have found the last 18 months easy," he said.

"Going in and out of lockdowns, having to wear masks, being unable to celebrate big occasions, and the over arching concern about Covid-19 breaching the Temora Shire border has really

"This wretched virus is going to be with us for quite some time and as the country develops a new way of living with it, Temora Shire residents will also continue to do themselves, Council, and me, proud - I'm certain of it" he said.

"We don't yet know what lies in our path in relation to the virus, but whatever challenges face us, I know our shire

community will pull together and continue to show determination, patience, compassion, and resilience."

Mayor Firman reiterated that Councillors and staff will continue to work hard for the Shire community within a Covid safe manner.

"We are here to help wherever we possibly can."

"I just want to acknowledge the hard work our residents have put in, and warmly thank them from the bottom of my heart for doing the right thing and continuing to ensure the safety of our entire Temora Shire community," he concluded.

Workers Compensation Claims

APPROXIMATELY 280,000 workers who suffered a workplace injury between October 2012 and October 2019 are being encouraged to come forward to see if they are owed money on their workers compensation claim.

There are more than 24,000 workers in the Illawarra and South East NSW region who may be eligible for reassessment of their past weekly workers compensation payments.

NSW workers compensation insurer icare (formerly WorkCover NSW) is inviting NSW workers to request a reassessment of their past weekly workers compensation payments, to ensure they have been paid correctly.

In 2012, the way workers compensation payments in NSW were calculated changed. This changed the information required and the calculation process insurance companies used to determine the weekly compensation payments for people who had suffered a work-related injury.

icare initiated a review of how weekly workers compensation payments were calculated by insurers. icare looked into a sample of payments and found some incorrect calculations. In some instances, this may have resulted in people being underpaid.

So, if you or someone you care for received payments from 2012 onwards, you may be owed money.

Find out if you're owed money

To lodge an assessment, all you need to do is meet the criteria for eligibility, then complete and submit an online form. icare will then pass your enquiry on to a claims manager who will evaluate your claim. They will contact you to let you know they've received your request.

What are the possible outcomes?

1. *You have been underpaid*
This will result in a one-off reimbursement to you. If you are currently receiving benefits, your ongoing weekly payments may also be adjusted.
2. *You have been overpaid*
You will not be required to pay back any overpayment. However, if you are currently receiving benefits, ongoing weekly payments may be adjusted.
3. *No change*
After assessing your application there may be no change to your current payments or reimbursement.
4. *An assessment is not possible*
This may be an outcome if you have a claim that has previously been settled.

Local Roads and Communication Infrastructure Funding

THE Federal Government's Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Fund Road 3 has allocated \$1,651,936 to the Temora Shire to be spent in 2022.

Councillors decided on the final list of projects to be presented for nomination for funding under this program at the August Council meeting. These projects will now be presented to the funding body for review and approval:

- The aim of the funding is to:
- Construct and maintain roads managed by local government with consideration to works that support improved road safety outcomes.
- Construct, maintain and/or improve Council-owned community infrastructure that is generally accessible to the

public.

"We are very appreciative to our Federal MP, Mr Michael McCormack who initiated this program by the Federal Government," said Mayor Rick Firman.

"This funding will allow Council to deliver much needed upgrades far sooner than originally planned. Our hardworking staff will carry out these upgrades and maintenance on top of their regular tasks, for which we are very grateful," said Mayor Firman.

"The projects will generate a demand for tradespeople, goods and services from the Temora Shire community, which in turn helps our local economy," he concluded.

SunSPoT

THE SunSPoT Solar Potential Tool assesses the sustainability of rooftops in Temora Shire for the installation of solar panels.

It also gives an estimate of how much electricity could be generated and how much money solar panels (and batteries if desired) could save the owner each year.

SunSPoT makes it easy for homeowners and other smaller energy users to understand what investing in solar can do for them – before they get quotes from solar companies.

Users search for their address in the online tool and SunSPoT colour codes the spaces of the roof to show the best areas for solar panel placement – indicated by red and orange dots.

Users simply outline the area for the solar panels, and SunSPoT estimates the energy generation and savings potential.

The calculations become

more accurate when the user adds existing electricity billing and usage information.

- How much money will a solar PV system save me in a year?
- What are the best areas for solar panels on my building roof?
- What size system is best?
- How much energy will it generate?
