Council's Acting General Manager, Elizabeth Smith. "More of the cost of production will be injected into the local newspaper rather than in printing costs with outside agencies as is the case with the current method," she said.

Council recognises that for some residents, the Narraburra News is a welcome item in their mailbox each month. "We know that some residents will be disappointed by this decision, but we hope

that they will understand our reasons for this change. "The content and design of the new format will be very much the same, but our residents will be reading it in the newspaper or electronically in the future," she concluded.

The Narraburra News will appear in the Temora Independent at the end of each month to bring residents news of the forthcoming month including event notifications and Council news.

### Village Flood Study Calling for Feedback

TEMORA Shire Council engaged consultants to undertake the Aria Park and Springdale Flood Study. The study is jointly funded by Council and the NSW Department of Planning, Industry and Environment.

The purpose of the Flood Study is to define the impact that flooding has on the villages of Aria Park and Springdale for a range of storm events. The community is invited to review and comment on the draft report which is currently on public exhibition at the White

Rose Cafe in Aria Park and Council's offices in Temora between 21 May and 18 June 2021.

## STRONGER COUNTRY COMMUNITIES BRINGS MORE PROJECTS TO TEMORA SHIRE

The NSW Government's Stronger Country Communities Fund has delivered much-needed upgrades, and some exciting projects, to our Shire over the past three years. Round 4 of the program is now open and we need your help to determine how the \$789,141 of allocated funding will be spent in the Temora Shire. The objectives of the fund are:

1. To boost the liveability of communities in regional areas by providing new or upgraded social and sporting infrastructure or community programs that have strong local support.
2. To deliver enhanced infrastructure and programs that remove barriers to female

participation in sport across regional NSW.

The minimum grant funding amount for an individual project is \$50,000.

A workshop held by Councillors on May 21<sup>st</sup>, 2021 identified potential projects to be considered for funding under this program.

Among the suggestions for projects to be considered are:

- Modify storage room to create women's change room at Temora Recreation Ground
- Refurbish existing change rooms at Bob Aldridge Park
- Widen and resurface netball courts and install lights at Nixon Park
- Outdoor gym with rubber softfall, upgrade to laundry/change room,

outdoor seating /shade area at skate park, extension on western side of netball court at Aria Park Recreation Ground

- Install toddler splash park and disability hoist for pool at the Recreation Centre
- Long jump pit upgrade for athletics, additional shade, grassed area and resheet carpark on eastern side at Nixon Park
- Walkway to improve access to museum at the Bundawarra Centre
- Expansion/upgrade of current CCTV system
- Shade sails at Nixon Park and Lake Centenary playgrounds
- Upgrade toilets at Harper Park, Aria Park
- Footpath Works

As part of the program guidelines, selected projects must have evidence of community support. Therefore, Council is conducting a survey asking the community to rank the proposed projects in order of preference, or to suggest other projects Council may consider for the program.

A special meeting of Council will be held on Tuesday 8<sup>th</sup> June to finalise Council's preferred projects prior to making the relevant applications.

## Updating your dog or cat's details on the NSW Companion Animals Register

IT is a requirement in NSW for all cats and dogs to be microchipped and placed on the NSW Pet Registry by the time they reach 12 weeks of age, or prior to sale, whichever comes first.

If it's not already done prior to collecting your pet from the breeder or previous owner, you can microchip your pet at the local vets where they'll insert the tiny microchip into the back of your pet's neck and add your pet's details to the registry. Once

that is done you can log on to the registry, make a profile and 'claim' your pet in the database by searching for the microchip number and your contact details.

Desexed pets are registered at a discounted rate.

The NSW Pet Registry enables lost pets to be reunited with their owners and is now available for cat and dog owners to:

- create an owner profile
- update their contact

details

- transfer ownership of pets
- report their pet missing, and
- pay most lifetime registration fees online.

The Pet Registry will also be used by pet breeders, vets and authorised identifiers. Pet breeders, who create a profile on the Pet Register, will be able to have their new litters added straight to their profile. Veterinarians and authorised identifiers are

able to enter a pet's details directly onto the Pet Registry as part of their microchipping service, reducing errors and making data entry more efficient.

For the time being, paper forms are still available for those who cannot use the Pet Registry, but this is being phased out.

People with assistance and working dogs will also need to register their dog in person at their local council.

## Paper DA's a Thing of the Past

FROM July 1<sup>st</sup> 2021, Temora Shire Council will comply with the NSW Government directive to provide all planning services online.

Council is committed to making this transition from a paper-based process to an online method as simple as possible for the community.

The online service will allow applicants to access planning services and information from anywhere at any time. This is a convenient alternative to paper-based transactions that can only take place during business hours.

In order to use the service, applicants must first have a Service NSW

account. Residents may already have an account through other NSW Government programs, such as Dine & Discover and Active and Creative Kids vouchers.

The ePlanning program allows users to submit a Development Application (DA online through the Planning Portal). Council can review the DA and request to receive additional documents before making a determination. Applicants will be notified of the result of their application by email.

Once a DA or Complying Development Certificate (CDC) is lodged, applicants will be notified by email of the

relevant application fees. Applicants can choose to pay online via a bank transfer payment, or by visiting Council's office during business hours to pay by debit, credit card or cash.

Applicants without access to a computer can utilise the computers at Temora Library. Those requiring assistance to lodge an application online can book an appointment with Council staff in the planning kiosk.

Potential applicants are still strongly encouraged to make an appointment to discuss their proposed application with planning staff in a pre-lodgement consultation in person, by phone or by email.

## Safer Road Conditions at Aria Park

FOR years the turn off to Aria Park on Burley Griffin Way has been a bone of contention for locals regarding its safety.

Several accidents, some of which were very serious, have occurred at the intersection.

Last month, Council commenced improvements at the intersection on behalf of Transport for NSW.

"We are improving safety for turning traffic at the intersection through the installation of a protected

right-hand turning lane," said Council's Engineering Works Manager, Alex Dahlenburg.

"Further, the widening will allow for a left turn deceleration lane when turning left into Aria Park from the Griffith direction."

Over \$500,000 will be invested into the project by the Federal Government which has come with some conditions.

"Council is required to permanently close Bryces Hill Road as part of the funding agreement," said

Mr Dahlenburg.

"Fencing will prevent motorists from accessing the road," he concluded.

During the works, temporary detour signs may be in place on Mary Gilmore Way for vehicles travelling out of, or through Aria Park, which will see this traffic diverted up Barnes Street and Davidson Street to access Burley Griffin Way.

Council apologises for any inconvenience this may cause.

## REMINDER OF PRIMARY PRODUCER REGISTRATION CONCESSIONS



Primary Producer vehicle registration rules changed in Feb 2021.

FROM February 4th, 2021, eligible primary producers must provide the following to be granted a primary producer concession when establishing, transferring or changing the usage on a vehicle registration:

- Declaration of Eligibility for a Registration Concession

### AND ONE OF THE FOLLOWING:

- A declaration signed by a registered tax

agent or accountant stating the applicant is a primary producer as defined by the Motor Vehicles Taxation Act 1988 OR

- A Tax Averaging Certificate or a Tax Assessment Notice from the Australian Taxation Office (not more than 2 years old) OR

• A letter from the Australian Taxation Office confirming the applicant is registered as a primary producer

(not more than one year old).

### Note:

1. Heavy Vehicles have different eligibility requirements until 30 June 2021.

2. Primary producer vehicles are not:

- Used for let (leased)
- Used for hire (rented)
- Used to receive a fee or reward (including a fee or reward from another primary producer).
