A Boom Time Forum was held prior to Covid that proved to be very

successful.

"We have a lot going on and residents of Temora Shire could really benefit from having a better understanding of these projects and the peripheral effects such as housing and employment opportunities."

"Temora Shire Council is made up of over 180 staff members working in fields such as engineering, administration, business development, public safety, heritage, communications, accounting, IT, disability and aged care, logistics, tourism, mechanics and environmental services," said Mayor Firman. "Careers at council can be in almost any field."

To finish off the week, Councillor Belinda Bushell will be reading the story at the Library's Storytime at 10.15am on Friday 5th August.

"Obviously our staff

look after roads, rates and rubbish, but there is a great deal more to what council does and we are mighty proud of the people who work and volunteer with council to ensure our community is cared for," said Mayor Firman.

Embrace and GROW

SOME very exciting things are happening in the Community Services department of Council that will ensure Temora Shire is a welcoming and embracing community for all newcomers.

"We are re-establishing our Embrace Temora Committee as our involvement with the NSW GROW program advances and we ready ourselves to be an even more welcoming community," said Community & Economic Development Officer, Shontayne Ward.

The Embrace Temora Committee was initially formed in 2019 in an effort to ensure Temora Shire is well equipped to welcome new residents from migrant and refugee backgrounds.

"The need to fill skill shortages in several of our industries meant that we needed to explore alternatives to attract new residents to call Temora Shire 'home'," said Ms Ward.

Whilst the committee developed some positive foundations and actively worked to relocate a family, it became evident that although the community were ready to welcome the newcomers, the fundamental support services were not yet in place, such as cultural,

language and specialist migrant supports.

This lesson led Council to connect with Multicultural NSW through Regional Development Australia (RDA) Riverina to be part of the pilot program, NSW Growing Regions of Welcome (GROW) program.

"We've been quietly working in the background with the NSW GROW program, in consultation with stakeholders from many areas of the community, and are now ready to officially launch the program," she said.

Leeton Shire is also part of the pilot program.

"We are working with Leeton to share ideas and practices. Leeton already has quite a diverse cultural community and we are learning a great deal from them through our connections through the NSW GROW program," said Ms Ward.

"We are thrilled to be working in conjunction with local employers, the Community Centre, TAFE Temora, local real estates, health services, schools and culturally diverse people in our community to ensure the GROW program is a success in Temora Shire," she said. "Our participation in this program means we will have the support of facilitators and

other communities to ensure our readiness to welcome newcomers to our region."

The Embrace Temora
Committee is working
towards creating a New
Resident Network to compliment both the Country
Change and the NSW
GROW programs.

"We have several events in the planning stages designed to welcome all newcomers to our region.

"The New Resident's Network, or 'Friends of Embrace Temora', will consist of people within the community who would like to play an active role in delivering events and programs that aim to integrate new residents into the Temora Shire community," she said.

"We are seeking expressions of interest from residents to be part of this network."

"We are looking for people who would like to participate in a variety of ways," she said. "From simple coffee catch-ups, assisting with language and cultural needs, assisting in navigating government agencies, to simply being a friend.

"There are so many ways the existing community can help new residents to settle into Temora Shire."

All About Your Rates

RATE Notices for the 2022/2023 financial year have been issued recently.

How are my rates calculated?

There are four main rating categories – residential. business, farmland and mining. Your rates are calculated by Council based on the value of your land, the category your property falls under and any pension concession you may be eligible to receive. The rating category or sub-category is shown on your Rate Notice. If the use of your land changes, or is different to what is shown on your Rate Notice, it is your responsibility to notify Council.

There are a range of services for which Council is required to place a levy on that is separate to funds raised by general rates. These include:

- Domestic waste all residential properties within the designated area are charged a domestic waste charge. Non-vacant properties receive a weekly kerbside collection as part of this charge. Vacant properties receive a nominal charge.
- Trade waste nonresidential properties within the designated area are charged a trade waste charge.

 Storm water levy – all rateable occupied properties in the 'urban area' receive an annual charge to raise revenue to fund the upgrade and general maintenance of the stormwater drainage system.

Sewerage service - all residential properties to which sewer is available are charged a residential sewerage access charge. Non-residential properties are charged a combination of a sewerage access charge and a sewer usage charge. You can view the Best Practice Management pricing guidelines for a better understanding of these calculations at www.industry.nsw.gov.au/ water/waterutilities/bestpractice-mgmt/ pricing.

The increase in general rates charged from one year to the next is determined by the rate peg percentage which is set by the Independent Pricing and Regulatory Tribunal (IPART). In 2022/2023 the rate peg percentage is 0.70% with an additional Special Rate Variation of 1.3% giving a total of 2.0%. This means that Council can only increase the total rate revenue collected from general rates by 2.0%.

Why did my rates increase by more than the rate peg percentage?

 The rate peg only applies to Council's total general rating income collected from all assessments. Individual assessments are also affected by changes to land valuations and therefore an individual assessment may increase by more, or less, than the rate peg amount depending on the movement in the valuation of the property.

How can I pay my rates? There are a number of ways you can pay your rates:

- At Council offices during business hours
- At Australia Post outlets
- Auspost.com.au/ postbillpay or phone 13 18 16
- By phone with a credit card – 6980 1100
 BPAY & BPAYView (Biller
 - Code 365353)
 Direct debit (yearly, quarterly, or fortnightly)

Please note DEFT payment systems (Biller Code 95303) are no longer available. If you are facing genuine

financial hardship and require assistance, please contact Council on 6980 1100.

What if I'm a pension concession card holder? All NSW Councils offer a

rebate of half of the general rate levied up to \$250, and half of the sewerage charge levied up to \$87.50. The maximum rebate pensioners are eligible for is \$337.50

each year.

If you are a Pension Concession Card holder, or a Department of Veterans Affairs (DVA) Gold Card holder stamped TPI or EDA, you may be eligible for a rebate on your primary place of residence. If you start receiving the pension after the commencement of the rating period, you will be eligible for a part year pension rebate at the beginning of the next quarter. Application forms are available from Council's offices. The state of NSW does not grant concessions on Health Care Cards.

Can I receive my rates notices electronically? Ratepayers can now receive their rates notice electronically. Ratepayers control the registration of their email address and are given access to the site via a username and secure password. This facility will also archive notices received after the date of registration so they can be accessed by the ratepayer at any time.
