Festival of Place Funding

TEMORA Shire Council has successfully obtained a grant of \$15,000 under the NSW Government's Summer Night fund as part of the Festival of Place. As a result, several community cultural events are scheduled to be held in March and April 2022.

The Festival of Place is an initiative of the NSW Government that aims to deliver on-the-ground festivals and events, community activities and creative interventions, storytelling, local street and public space improvements throughout the state.

"These events will allow residents to reconnect with our cultural spaces and the wider community after many months of closure," said Council's Town Planner, Claire Golder.

"Residents will have opportunities to commence ongoing connections to art and culture through workshops, book clubs and film clubs by attending these exciting events."

"The grant funding will be shared between the events and will allow for the provision of equipment to support hosting the events and creating a welcoming atmosphere," said Mrs Golder.

"Public spaces connect us, inspire us and make us healthier and happier. The COVID-19 Pandemic has made us appreciate the role of public spaces in supporting our health and well-being and our sense of community."

Council have planned three events under this funding: Book Club and Community Reopening of Temora Shire Library

The library has recently undergone significant upgrades. An official reopening and launch of a book club is scheduled to take place at 6pm on Thursday 10th March 2022.

 Construction Works

Temora Lawn Cemetery New Plinth

WORKS have commenced at Temora Lawn Cemetery to construct the next new concrete burial headstone plinth. Initial preparation included general earthworks through the placement of a gravel strip. During mid-January, excavation, footings, steel placement and the pouring of concrete was undertaken. The remainder of the works will see headstones installed, rocks between headstones placed, topsoil backfill, irrigation works and the laying of turf.

It is expected the works will extend over a period of six to eight weeks, which may be extended if work is impacted by wet weather. Works will also not proceed during funerals. Council asks that residents avoid the construction site when

avoid the construction site when visiting the Temora Cemetery, particularly when attending any funerals that have a burial in the plinth row adjacent to the new one. We apologise for any inconvenience during these works which may include some construction noise.

Commemoration of Temora's Chinatown

THE Friends of Temora Shire Cemeteries (FOTSC) are inviting all community members to a Chinese Memorial Commemoration Ceremony at 11am on Saturday 5th February to acknowledge the placement of a plaque in the Chinese portion of the Temora Cemetery. A quartz stone with a plaque has been selected to mark the portion of the cemetery in recognition of the gold mining history of the area. A feng shui specialist was also consulted to ensure Chinese culture and traditions are appropriately

observed The Chinese were among the many people who flocked to Temora from different parts of the world working in the Temora district before Temora was a town. Many worked in groups clearing the land on various properties in the wider areas as early as the 1860s. The discovery of gold in 1880 brought a few Chinese immigrants, but the majority of the Chinese population came to the diggings around 1883. This

sudden influx was the beginning of Chinatown. Chinatown grew out along Trungley Road to the north of town and spread across towards the current Barmedman Road and to where the Agricultural Research Station is today.

Chinatown was a complete town. It had homes, shops, pubs, brothels, an open air dance floor, a joss house and other places of entertainment. Over the years the residents either moved away from Temora or purchased substantial buildings in the township and Chinatown and the buildings gradually disappeared. Several Chinese went on to become auite entrepreneurial with

businesses popular with all the Temora folk. Many Chinese who came to Temora did not return home. There are over 30 Chinese names in the Temora Courthouse death records between 1898 and 1937. Many Chinese were Christian converts and as such were

buried in their respective religion portions of the Temora Cemetery. Other Chinese were buried in the Chinese portion of the cemetery. These graves would have been marked with a small concrete or stone headstone with Chinese writing etched into the stone. The Chinese portion of the Temora Cemetery is now bare of any headstones. Unconfirmed stories have emerged stating that the Chinese section was vandalised in the late 1920s or early 1930s. Sadly there are no records stating who is buried
