Report Illegal Dumping -RIDonline

COUNCIL have an open-door policy to encourage residents to report illegal dumping of waste in the Temora Shire. Residents are urged to report any illegal dumping anonymously by contacting Council directly. Alternatively, vou can report illegal dumping online via RIDonline.

RIDonline is a database used by councils and government agencies across NSW to record and manage illegal dumping incidents.

When you report via RIDonline, Council will receive an email alert about the incident so it can be responded to.

When you report illegal dumping, you help the EPA and local council to:

- Protect human health and the environment Detect and penalise dumpers
- Find and clean up dumped waste
- Identify dumping hot spots so we can

develop strategies to prevent this behaviour in the future in our Shire

If the dumped waste is an emergency, such as containing toxic fumes or a large chemical spill, call 000 and report it immediately.

If the dumped waste is an immediate threat to human health or the environment then call FPA Environment Line on 131 555.

Examples of waste that can threaten human health or the environment include asbestos or toxic chemicals.

- To report dumping: Visit RIDonline with your smartphone, tablet or computer and upload a picture of the dumped waste
- Provide the address of the incident using the GPS on your device or select a location on the provided map
- Describe the type of dumped waste
- Submit your report

HOSKINS STREET PAVEMENT IMPROVEMENTS

HAVE you recently observed surveyors working in Hoskins Street, Temora and wondered what they were doing?

Transport for NSW (TfNSW) is the road manager for state highways, just like Temora Shire Council is for our own local roads.

Burley Griffin Way and Goldfields Way are both classified state highway roads under TfNSW management, but did you know this also includes the urban sections of these roads through Hoskins Street, Victoria Street, Vesper Street and Junee

When a state road goes through an urban centre, TfNSW is responsible for the maintenance and upgrade works for the centre nine metres of road as depicted in the image attached (far right). Council is the responsible road manager outside that nine metre centre section.

Temora Shire Council does operate under a Roads Maintenance Council Contract (RMCC) which means we are contracted to TfNSW to undertake maintenance and capital works projects as planned and agreed upon by TfNSW as the road manager.

Have you also noticed the declining condition and rough surface of the road pavement through Hoskins Street? This is why TfNSW surveyors have been recently working in Hoskins Street capturing survey data to coincide with road pavement geotechnical testing and underground drainage asset inspections.

This work is all being completed as lead up design work for a large capital project TfNSW is funding in the 2022/23 and 2023/24 respective financial years. The project aims to upgrade the road pavement and surface from south of the

Victoria Street intersection through to the northern side of Grey Street intersection. This multi-million dollar capital upgrade project will vastly improve the road pavement, compared to its current condition, but will see significant interruptions to vehicular and pedestrian movements during the construction phase.

Once the project final design is completed by TfNSW and provided to council, consultation will be undertaken with stakeholders, including businesses in Hoskins Street, as part of the planning phase of the project.

Temora Community Events Program

Temora Shire Council was allocated \$239,651 through the Reconnecting Regional NSW -Community Events Program to assist with the delivery of community events

Council called for **Expressions of Interest** (EOI) from within the community for event concepts that meet the funding criteria. Council received 26 submissions totaling \$456,156

On Tuesday 7th June, Council held a special meeting to determine which events will be funded under the

Community Events Program. Council believes that the 19 events which were approved will promote greater social cohesion, bringing people back together to create improved social outcomes along with opportunities to facilitate economic recovery for businesses and services that have been impacted by COVID-19 restrictions.

All applicants were notified of the outcome on Wednesday 8th June. The Council approved events will now be submitted for final assessment by the Commissioner of

Resilience NSW. The assessment

process is expected to take up to two weeks.

Council will inform applicants of the status of their application, in writing, as soon as possible after funding decisions are made by Resilience NSW.

The range of events approved is diverse.

The community can start looking forward to sporting days, cultural perform-ances and events, art exhibitions, music festivals, community fairs, art workshops and public holiday celebrations.




