TEMORA TOWN ENTRANCE BEAUTIFICATION PROJECT

IN late 2019, a project was delivered under the Stronger Country Communities Fund (SCCF) Round 2 grant program to beautify the entrances into the Temora township.

The project included earthworks to make approaches on Goldfields Way and Burley Griffin Way fully accessible for mowing maintenance, and the planting of tree lines in these areas.

"The tree lines are strategically placed so they are not impinging on the road shoulder or impacting the drainage system," said Manager of Engineering Services, Rob Fisher.

"Tree species were chosen based on a combination of matching existing plants and introducing new species where practicable that would make a statement on the approach to the urban area," he said.

"Goldfields Way, on the southern side of Temora, has two different types of trees on each side of the road. This was due to height restrictions due to overhead powerlines."

Crepe Myrtles line the western side of Goldfields Way as they grow to a maximum of 6 metres and can be maintained safely under the powerlines.

"The other side of the road has Poplar trees aiming to achieve a larger maturing tree," he said.

The amount of recent rainfall in Temora has certainly assisted in the trees maturing well.

Community Building Partnership

THE Community Building Partnership Fund is open for applications until June 10th and there is \$400,000 per electorate up for grabs.

Incorporated not-for-profit community organisations and local councils are eligible to apply for grants between \$5,000 and \$150,000. The average grant awarded is around \$20,000.

Projects with contributions from their own, or other sources,

will be considered favourably. Local councils, including their section 355 committees, are required to provide matched funding to the CBP grants.

The NSW Government grant aims to invest in infrastructure projects that deliver positive social, environmental, and recreational outcomes, while also promoting community participation, inclusion and cohesion.

Temora Pool Upgrade Update

THE much-anticipated pool upgrade is well and truly underway with excavation around the existing pool in progress.

The \$2.2M upgrade includes an extension of the pool to include more lanes, resurfacing using the Myrtha System which uses a series of stainless steel and waterproof membranes to create a watertight seal, recessed ladders and a long ramp and steps for accessibility.

The work is being carried out by the ELM Group Pty Ltd who were also contracted for the construction of the indoor pool and splash park.

"The system proposed by the ELM Group ensures the longevity of the pool which ultimately reduces maintenance costs in the long run," explained Director of Environmental Services, Kris Dunstan.

"The existing pool will be resurfaced, and the extra two lanes added, meaning swimmers will feel like they have an entirely new pool," Mr Dunstan said.

The existing diving board will be retained and refurbished as part of the upgrades.

Mayor Rick Firman is very

pleased with the progression of the upgrades.

"This is a very exciting project for our community," said the Mayor. "Our much loved pool has been a staple in the lives of residents for 80 years. These upgrades ensure that future generations will be able to enjoy this wonderful facility."

The Elm Group were also chosen for their commitment to ensure local businesses benefit from the project.

"Local contractors are being engaged to carry out the work whilst accommodation providers and hospitality venues also benefit during construction," explained Mayor Firman.

"These upgrades will mean more residents can access the pool and that the community has a facility we can all be proud of," he said.

"With the waterslide, splash park, indoor pool, toddler pool and now an impressive Olympic swimming pool, the Temora Recreation Centre will be a drawcard, not only to locals, but to visitors to our community as well.

Red Shield Appeal This Weekend

DID you know that you can run video advertising at the Temora Town Hall Theatre?

"Businesses, sporting groups and community groups can run 15 second or 30 second video ads over a month for very reasonable prices, and it could all be filmed on your phone," said Theatre Manager, Guy Piltz.

Formats for videos accepted include MP4, MOV, AVI, WMV, MKV and JPEG. Applicants need to provide their content in the appropriate format on a USB upon payment.

Each advertisement will be shown between 26-32 sessions a

month from the first Wednesday of the elected month. Videos must not exceed the nominated length and should be appropriate for general viewing.

"A 15 second ad is just \$120 for the month and a 30 second ad is \$200 a month," said Mr Piltz.

"Advertising with us is very affordable and an effective way of getting messages out to the public."

GLOUCESTER PARK FOOTPATH UPGRADE

THE construction of a new concrete footpath in Gloucester Park has recently been undertaken by Council.

Funded under the Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program (LRCI) Round 3, the path links the playground to the Gloucester Street parking bays. The paths also connect the BBQ area, gazebos and toilets.

"The aim of the project is to

allow suitable access to the playground via a concrete path to provide equity and inclusiveness for all residents to use the new playground facility," said Engineering Works Manager, Alex Dahlenburg.

Local business, Craftsman Homes, was contracted for the concreting works and backfilling and installation of a bike rack have been completed by Council staff.
