

KITES BRIDGE AND DUCK CREEK BRIDGE

TEMORA Shire Council will receive crucial funding from the National Heavy Vehicle Regulator (NHVR) to determine the heavy vehicle capability of Kite's Bridge and Duck Creek Bridge.

The Kite's Bridge and Duck Creek Bridge assessments will be completed in the next three (3) months as part of the NHVR's Strategic

Local Government Asset Assessment Project (SLGAAP), supported by the Australian Government.

Council is increasingly seeing larger heavy vehicle combinations and associated loads looking to access the road network. These assessments will deliver a consistent approach and robust advice to provide Council with the

information required to make quality heavy vehicle access decisions.

NHVR CEO, Sal Petrocchio, said Temora Shire Council is one of 33 councils that will receive funding as part of the latest phase of the Australian Government's \$20 million investment in the program.

"Through SLGAAP, Temora Shire Council will work with an

engineering consultant who will undertake an assessment and provide a comprehensive report detailing what heavy vehicle combinations can safely travel over the structure," Mr Petrocchio said.

Mr Petrocchio said the work being done through SLGAAP will be accessed and stored on the NHVR Portal.

"Road managers can

use the NHVR Portal to record and view bridge and culvert assessment information such as reports and photos, to make informed decisions around heavy vehicle access in their local area.

"Ultimately the work under SLGAAP is all about enhancing road safety and increasing productivity across our heavy vehicle industry."


Sigrid Carr Youth Program Coordinator

Hoskins Street Road Upgrade

HAVE you noticed the declining condition of the Hoskins Street road surface?

Just like Temora Shire Council is responsible for maintaining local roads, Transport for NSW (TfNSW) is responsible for managing state highways, such as Burley Griffin Way and Goldfields Way.

This includes the centre nine metres of road pavement in urban sections of State roads through Hoskins Street, Victoria Street, Vesper Street and Junee Road.

Transport for NSW (TfNSW) is preparing to upgrade the centre nine meters of the Hoskins Street pavement in the 2023/24 financial year.

To date, they have completed geotechnical investigation and surveying. They are now in the design and project development

phases for works between the Britannia Street intersection the Kitchener Road intersection.

Works on this multi-million-dollar capital upgrade project are planned to commence in August 2023.

Whilst the works will vastly improve the road pavement compared to its current condition, there will be significant interruptions to vehicular and pedestrian movements during the construction phase.

A public forum will be held with stakeholders, including businesses in Hoskins Street, once the final project design is completed by TfNSW and provided to Council. In addition to TfNSW consultation and notifications, Council will keep residents and businesses informed about the project to help minimise the impacts.

the basics of fishing and will have the opportunity to talk to Education Officers and Fishcare Volunteers.


All equipment needed for the day will be provided, as well as the bait and some helpful advice.
