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# INTRODUCTION

Temora Shire 2030 is the Community Strategic Plan developed by the Shire Community and provides a blueprint for the future direction of the community..

Originally prepared in 2011 and updated in 2016, the Plan identifies a number of strategic objectives for the Temora Shire community. This report provides an update on how progress towards those objectives is being made and will be an important part of the review of the Community Strategic Plan as it is updated and rolled forward in the coming months.

This report will detail the activities of Council in response to Temora Shire 2030. The reporting timeframe is very different from previous periods due to the impact of the Covid 19 pandemic. Instead of the normal 4 year cycle, this period has been extended to 5 years 3 months, effectively shortening the next term to 2 years 9 months.

The ultimate test of the effectiveness of the Council response to the Community Strategic Plan is the satisfaction levels of residents. Accordingly, the results of the 2021 Residents Satisfaction Survey undertaken by Council in September-October 2021 has been used to inform the report.

The Community Strategic Plan is currently subject to a consultation process with a view to the development of a new document to form the basis of the Integrated Planning and Reporting process in 2022/23. It is intended that the new document will be presented to Council for consideration early in the new term of Council.

The community vision identified in Temora Shire 2030 is:

"Our community strives to reflect the qualities of its greatest asset – its people – those friendly, supportive, practical, hardworking, and successful people. Whilst holding on to the strengths of our past, we embrace change and grasp every opportunity to enhance our environment, economy, and lifestyle."

From the NSW Integrated Planning & Reporting Guidelines, supporting the Local Government Act 1993:

A report on the progress on implementation of the Community Strategic Plan must be presented at the final meeting of an outgoing council.

The review must include the following:

- A report from the outgoing council on the implementation and effectiveness of the Community Strategic Plan in achieving its social, environmental, economic and civic leadership objectives over the past four years,
- A review of the information that informed the original Community Strategic Plan,
- A Community Engagement Strategy.

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# MAYOR'S MESSAGE

It is with great pride that I present to you the End of Term Report for the Temora Shire Council.

It seems like a long time since the last election in 2016, a term that has been

extended due to Covid 19 to a period of 5 years 3 months. This term has encapsulated a very unstable time of restrictions, lockdown, employment uncertainty and public health fears as we charted a course through areas that Communities have not faced in living memory.

The effect of the extended term will be that the next elected Council will serve 2 years and 9 months rather than the legislated 4-year period.

If there is a positive accruing from the Coronavirus, the past term, especially since early 2020, has seen the flow of funds through grants at a level never before seen. This, along with funds to offset the effect of drought, has provided the opportunity for the development of significant community infrastructure.

The Community Strategic Plan, "Temora 2030" established 6 themes, notably:

- Retaining our quality of life
- Engaging and supporting the community
- Building the Shires economy
- Preserving our beautiful surrounds
- Embracing and developing aviation
- Enhancing our agricultural wealth

This report will provide details as to how Council have performed in response to the Community Strategic Plan.

The aim of Council is to produce a pathway to the future that ensures that Temora Shire develops in a manner that is in tune with the expectations of our community, as outlined in the Community Strategic Plan. This task is multifaceted as consideration is given to demographics, economic sustainability, community expectation, representation and accountability.

The term has provided many assets, as highlighted in this report. Special mention should be made of projects such as Temora Memorial Town Hall redevelopment, Temora Recreation Centre Upgrade, Coolamon Street Ariah Park upgrade, Ariah Park Recreation Ground upgrade, Nixon Park redevelopment and Upgrade works at Temora Aerodrome however, it is the planning that Council have undertaken that will provide lasting benefits to the community. These include Flood Studies for Ariah Park, Springdale and Temora, Integrated Water Cycle Management Plan, development of forward plans for Amenity Trees, Pedestrian Access and Mobility, Roads Hierarchy, Temora Shire Local Environment Plan review, Economic Development, Aerodrome Management, Temora Agricultural Innovations Centre, and Affordable Housing Strategy.

The challenge for the new Council will be to implement the strategies highlighted in these documents for the betterment of our shire community.

In conclusion, may I say that it has been an absolute honour and privilege to serve as Mayor of Temora Shire Council for the past term. I place on record, my gratitude to the Deputy Mayor, Cr Graham Sinclair, and fellow Councillors, who have worked tirelessly in their roles. I thank the General Manager, Directors and staff of Temora Shire Council for their hard work and dedication in meeting targets in a very difficult environment. Finally, and most importantly, I would like to thank the shire volunteers and community who have supported the activities of Council and staff. Without all parties working together, we could not have achieved what we have in the past 5 years.

# **COUNCILLOR REFLECTIONS**



This current term of council has been by far the most interesting, diverse and exciting of my time as a Temora Shire Councillor.

We have been very successful in attracting new residents through Country Change to businesses looking to relocate from metropolitan areas.

The community has managed to attract unprecedented funding through several rounds of grants which is resulting in the Shire gaining new and updated infrastructure that we would normally only dream about.

Of course Covid has played a big part in our lives over the past 18-20 months, but being a rural community has meant we are getting off relatively lightly compared to our city cousins. It has been a great privilege to have been elected by the community to serve as a councillor and then to be elected by my fellow councillors as Deputy Mayor.



The past five-year term of Council have been the busiest in my 44 years in Local Government. We have had extremes of weather with drought and wet weather, persevered with the trials of Covid 19, but compensated by some good seasons on the farm. Unprecedented grant funds from the State and Federal Governments have seen our communities achieve projects that we were only dreaming of in the future.

My concern for the future of local government is that the present workload and timing of meetings make it impossible for anyone working a 9 to 5 job to be on Council. I also fear for the future financial viability of rural Councils as they battle cost shifting and the detrimental effect that asset revaluation and depreciation that is having on our balance sheet.



This term of Council has been a very productive one for Temora Shire Council. With several grants from both the State and Federal Governments which have allowed Council to address many projects on the strategic plan, giving a bit of boost to community morale. This together with last year's bumper harvest and another on the horizon, levels of confidence in the community are extremely high. Notwithstanding the current Covid-19 pandemic. We have new subdivisions opening up, investors spending millions on new developments and a general feeling of well-being in the shire.

Indeed, the only complaints I hear are just how difficult it is to find a park in our Main Street, not because of the lack of parking spaces but just how busy it is.



With the support of the community, Temora Shire Council has achieved some fantastic improvements for the Shire over the past 5 years. In particular, I reflect on the upgrades to Nixon Park, the creation of an Arts Precinct, as well as the establishment of a Group Home. The rallying of the Temora community to save our hospital from downgrades was also a highlight. There have been many other amazing improvements to roads, bridges, and other infrastructure all over the Shire of which we can all be very proud of. It has been an honour and a privilege to have served the community of Temora over the past 5 years.



Thank you to the other Councillors for their support over the past five years. Their knowledge and the years of experience is remarkable. Thank you also to the staff too for their support during my term.

It has been a very busy 5 years, and I am fortunate to have been a part of a proactive Council. Some of the highlights are:

- Construction of the home for supported independent living
- Purchase of the scout hall for an art precinct
- Purchase of Apollo Place for affordable housing
- The track around Lake Centenary
- · Completion of the Town Hall upgrade

Thank you to all the 355 committees I have had the pleasure of helping. Their passion of helping make our town the fantastic place it is to live in through volunteering for either TBEG, Town Hall Theatre, Friends of the Cemetery, Fruit Fly Committee, Women's Network, Film Club, Imagine Temora. their contribution is greatly appreciated.



The longest term in Local Government history is over. This was a term of major government grants to support many yearned-for projects. I applaud the massive co-operation that led to a new Arts Precinct, the improvements to the pool, serious thought about enhanced social housing, and further exciting developments at the airport. I congratulate Councillors and Senior Staff on their mutual support, and I hope this unity continues.



Most issues affecting Temora Shire come before Council and as such receive our utmost attention and consideration. This current Council has achieved so much over the last 5 years. One only has to look at the population growth with new homes to meet the needs of our new residents. The reputation of the Council is excellent. This doesn't just happen. It happens because we, along with an excellent staff work as a team and take our positions seriously, working together for the best outcome for the entire shire. It is an honour and a privilege to work with such a dedicated team.






