APPLICATIONS are now open for the 2019 Temora and District Education Fund Grants that aim to assist Temora Shire young people in pursuing further education.

Grant applications are open to anyone between the ages of 16 and 25 who have completed most, or all, of their schooling in the Shire and are pursuing further education through university, apprenticeship, traineeship or TAFE studies.

Grants usually range between \$500 and \$2000 and are provided as reimbursement for expenditure on things like text books, tools, fuel, travel, and accommodation.

Young people embarking on further education as part of career development are encouraged to apply for a TDEF grant.

*Pool Safety Spring Clean*

SPRING cleaning isn't just limited to the inside of your home. Here are some helpful pool safety checks to include on your to-do list:

- Does the pool have a barrier that complies with the Australian Standard 1926.1-1993/2012?  
*(To obtain a copy of this standard please contact Council and we will be happy to assist).*
- Is the pool barrier well maintained and in a good state of repair as an effective and safe barrier?
- Does the gate swing freely, close and latch by itself from any open position?
- Is there an appropriate resuscitation (CPR) sign in the immediate vicinity of the pool area?
- Is the resuscitation sign easily readable, do you require a new one?
- Is your pool fence clear of any objects such as BBQs, trees, rocks, shrubs, garden items and deckchairs that could assist someone to climb over the fence?  
*(Please Note: the non-climb zone is measured from the top of the horizontal and should be clear of any object at least by 900mm).*
- Is your current first aid certificate valid, do you need to schedule in some training for first aid?  
*(The above checklist is to be used as a guide only. Should you require further information or assistance in assessing the compliant nature of your swimming pool please contact Council and to arrange an inspection. This service requires a \$80 fee).*

## WIRED LAB WORKSHOPS FOR DROUGHT AFFECTED RESIDENTS

THERE'S a significant amount of research substantiating the benefits of the arts to the health of individuals and communities.

Bringing people together to engage in creative activities, particularly those who live in geographic isolation, has immense benefits both socially and individually.

If you live within our council area and have been affected by the drought, you may be eligible for a free place in one of The Wired Lab's upcoming workshops.

Assistance with travel and accommodation costs

to attend is also available.

The Wired Lab is an artist led organisation evolving interdisciplinary art practices in rural Australia. They create opportunities for the research, production and presentation of projects that connect international and local artists with communities in new ways.

Their curated programs and projects involve artists working from a regional context whilst producing outcomes of local and global relevance. The Wired Lab activities range from skills development for young people, seniors,

emerging and mid-career artists, to the creation, presentation, publication and promotion of new works and major live arts projects.

This initiative is made possible with a Murrumbidgee Community Grant, which is an initiative of Murrumbidgee Primary Health Network (Murrumbidgee PHN) and part of the Australian Government's 'Empowering our Communities' funding.

The Drought Subsidy Program provides subsidised (free) places to many of the creative workshops.

## Nuisance Barking Dogs

A NUMBER of factors can contribute to a dog barking. These include:

- Attention seeking or communication
- Provoked intentionally or unintentionally
- By seeing humans, wildlife or other pets
- Lack of space or exercise
- Sickiness or poor diet
- Separation anxiety
- Hungry or thirsty
- Being neglected
- Territorial
- Playfulness
- Boredom

Barking is a natural way for dogs to vocalise and communicate their feelings. Barking can signal warning, danger, play, panic, and fear. It is normal for all dogs to bark, but it is the owner's responsibility to ensure that the barking does not come to the point of being a nuisance.

You can avoid having a barking dog by making sure you provide the correct care for your pets and satisfy their needs. Nuisance barking is common when families are away from home. With no entertainment, a dog may easily become bored, lonely or frustrated, often leading to nuisance barking. To prevent your dog from becoming a nuisance you can try the following strategies.

- **Activity toys** - Some

of these toys dispense treats. Your dog will need to work to get the food rewards providing your dog with mental stimulation.

- **Exercise your dog** - Take your dog for a walk before you go to work or before the dog goes to bed depending on when the barking is an issue. A tired dog is a happy dog.

- **Remove direct line of sight** - If you have discovered that your dog is barking at people, other dogs or other things in the neighbourhood, try and cover any open fencing or gaps in the fence.

- **Citronella collars** - These collars release citronella into the air every time the dog barks which the dog finds unpleasant. The dog then learns not to bark whilst the collar is on. These collars cause no harm to the dogs and are endorsed by the RSPCA.

- **Company** - Some dogs don't like to be alone and feel the need for company. Another dog or pet may help. You do need to ensure that loneliness is the issue though, as dogs mimic each other's behaviours and you don't want two nuisance dogs.

If someone contacts Council and lodges a

complaint about a nuisance barking dog in the first instance Council will send the dog owner an information brochure explaining that Council has received a complaint and what methods can be used to prevent the dog from barking.

If the dog owner chooses not to do anything to prevent the dog from barking and Council receives another complaint, the Council Ranger will conduct an investigation to determine if the dog is, or is not, a nuisance.

If the Ranger's investigation determines that the dog is being a nuisance it is most likely that a Nuisance Order will be placed on the dog.

A Nuisance Order stays in place for 6 months in which time the owner is expected to take action to solve the issues.

Council's Ranger may issue a fine for \$275.00 for failing to comply with a Nuisance Order.

As part of the investigation the Ranger will check the identification (microchip) and registration of any animal that comes to their attention.

If a dog is not identified and registered, a notice will be issued asking the owner to do so. Failure to comply may result in a \$275.00 fine.

## DEVELOPER CONTRIBUTION PLAN 2019

THE INTENTION of the Developer Contribution Plan is to support Council in the delivery of additional community facilities in a timely manner.

When Council is able to make a financial contribution towards community projects the Developer Contribution Plan assists in the support of grant applications to complete the identified projects.

A consent authority may impose, as a condition of development consent, a requirement that the applicant pay a levy of the percentage, authorised by a contributions plan, of the proposed cost of carrying out the development.

Estimated development cost maximum fee payable: Up to \$100,000 - nil

\$100,000 - \$200,000 - 0.25% of the development cost  
More than \$200,000 - 0.5% of the development cost

These rates are half the maximum rate that Councils are allowed to collect.

Community projects that the Developer Contributions Plan is assisting Council to deliver from August 2019 are:

### Main Street Upgrade

Upgrade of Hoskins Street between Polaris Street and Parkes Street & Victoria Street and Britannia Street to enhance footpaths, street furniture and landscaping to complement existing upgrade of the main street.

### Loftus Street Pedestrian Upgrade

Upgrade pedestrian access to the western side of Loftus Street, at the corner of Hoskins Street.

### The Oval Improvements

Resurface existing sealed netball courts.

### Gloucester Park Upgrade

Provide additional paths and seating at Gloucester Park to improve accessibility.

### Ariah Park Main Street Upgrade

Improve the central island and parking in the main street of Ariah Park.

### Nixon Park Playground Fence

Provide a safety fence around the existing Nixon Park playground.

## Carrying Out Work on Nature Strips

THE LAND adjoining properties, located between the road and the property boundary, is known as the nature strip.

Temora Shire has a Road Verge and Nature Strips Policy that covers specific issues such as utilities and maintenance work, gutter crossings and

driveways, property access and firewood collection.

Where works are proposed on the nature strip it is a requirement that the property owner obtains the consent of Council using the online notification form. Applicants should notify Council at least three weeks prior to the

works commencing to allow officers to consider proposals and provide any conditions or comments.

Residents are not permitted to close off any part of Council's road, nature strip or footpath due to building or construction works, or in an attempt to manage traffic flow, with-

out the approval of Council.

Any alterations, including the installation of drains and pipes under driveways, must be approved by Council via the online form at least three weeks prior to work commencing.
