COVID-19 Vaccine Rolled Out

THE COVID-19 vaccination program commenced in NSW on 22 February 2021 with those at highest risk of exposure to the COVID-19 virus, or of severe disease, receiving the first doses of the vaccine. This includes our healthcare workers, quarantine and border staff, as well as aged and disability care staff and residents.

In NSW, the first phase of vaccinations was administered through three initial vaccination hubs at Westmead. Liverpool and Royal Prince Alfred Hospitals to 35,000 at risk workers over a three-week period. Since 10 March 2021 additional vaccination hubs and clinics have begun to open to support the roll-out of the vaccination program - including Wagga.

The vaccine will be progressively made

Australian residents in priority phases.

Whilst the vaccine is voluntary, the NSW Chief Health Officer, Dr Kerry Grant, is encouraging all Australians to get vaccinated

"The vaccines. together with continuing to practice COVID safe behaviours are the best ways to protect your family, friends and community," he said

"These workers are employed six (6) days a week and primarily need a place to lay their head for 3-4 months. Accommodation

solutions are required immediately and residents who are able to help are urged to contact Ann Pike at the Visitor Information Centre. "Ann's role will be to

create a register of available spaces and then to connect landlords with potential "Landlords will be

responsible for ensurin the legalities of letting a snace are in place and negiotiating terms and conditions directly with the lodgers," said Mr Sinclair.


