Crackdown on Illegal Dumping of Rubbish

ILLEGAL dumping of rubbish is an ongoing problem and Temora Shire Council is taking action.

"We have known hotspots and are sick of offenders thinking they can get away with the crime," said Director of Environmental Services, Kris Dunstan.

"We have purchased improved infrared motion sensing cameras and will be prosecuting all offenders when they get caught," he said.

How do I report illegal dumping?

Regardless of whether the land is public or private, illegal dumping is a crime and should be reported.

Note as many details of the incident as possible, including time, date, location, descriptions of the people involved, vehicles and number plates and anything else noticed.

Only call 000 if the incident is occurring or has just occurred and there is a chance to apprehend the offenders. You should also call 000 if there is a risk to life or property such as asbestos.

In a non-emergency situation you should contact the Environment Protection Authority at any time by phoning 13 15 55, emailing info@environment.nsw.gov.au or report online at

www.epa.nsw.gov.au/your-environment/litter-and-illegal-dumping/report-illegal-dumping.

If you have information that may identify offenders, contact NSW Crime Stoppers on 1800 333 000 or contact Temora Shire Council on 6980 1100 during business hours.

"Most people do the right thing and dispose of their waste appropriately. Unfortunately, there are some who don't follow the rules and the effects on the environment can be disastrous. We're very grateful for any help the community can provide," said Mr Dunstan.

Sewer Chokes and Blockages

ARE you aware of what actions to take if you have a sewer blockage on your property and who is responsible for clearing it?

If there is a sewer blockage present on the premises, where possible, the property owner should first inspect the Inspection Shaft to see if it is full or empty. If the Inspection Shaft is full or overflowing, this indicates either the property connection itself is blocked, or the main downstream is blocked and Council will attend to inspect it.

Council's 24-hour contact number is 02 6980 1100.

If the Inspection Shaft is empty, this indicates there is a blockage within the property and the property

owner should call a private plumber.

Where Council is requested to attend property connection blockages that are recurring in nature due to lack of preventative action from the landowner, the landowner will be charged for work provided by Council as per Council's published fees and charges which can be found at www.temora.nsw.gov.au/Your-Council/Fees-Charges.

Common causes of chokes, surcharges and blockages include:

- Tree roots through pipe joints or pipe structural

defects

- Structural damage to pipes due to age, damage, ground pressure etc.
- Domestic products including rubbish, children's toys, tennis balls, nappies, clothing, sanitary products, cooking waste, rocks or sand and other waste material not intended for processing by the sewer system
- Illegal connection of stormwater pipes or property downpipes
- Poor or incorrect construction of sewer drainage components

Here is a quick guide to cost responsibility associated with sewer maintenance:

Item	Cost
Clear sewer choke in sewer main	Council
Clear sewer choke in service line downstream of property connection (Inspection Shaft) to Council sewer main	Council
Clear sewer choke upstream of property connection and including Inspection Shaft	Owner to contact plumber
Clear initial sewer choke in property connection (once only)	Council
Clear recurring sewer choke in property connection	Owner
Property connection repair or replacement	Owner
Service line or main junction repair or replacement	Council
Sewer main repair or replacement	Council

Road Condition Update

THE ongoing wet weather has caused havoc with our roads network and will continue to affect the condition of many roads for some time.

The unprecedented weather events include declared natural disasters in the Temora Shire Council Local Government Area (LGA) in March 2021, November 2021, January 2022, and August 2022.

"Each time we experience significant rainfall, our roads take a punishing hit," said Engineering Works Manager, Alex Dahlenburg.

"Normally after a

significant weather event we undertake emergency response work, but we've been unable to deliver the further approved restoration works since the March 2021 event because of continued rainfall and subsequent significant events," he said. "As a result, the condition of some of our roads has continued to deteriorate."

With harvest fast approaching, Council is very aware that the poor condition of the roads may cause significant issues for harvest vehicles and machinery.

"Council is very sensitive

to the increased use of our roads during harvest but due to maintenance being delayed by prolonged wet weather, Council has a considerable backlog of maintenance work needing to be carried out," said Mr Dahlenburg.

While there is no immediate solution with two years' worth of damage to repair, Council will be prioritising restoration and maintenance work when able.

"Council has a few challenges to face as far as restoring the condition of affected roads," said Mr Dahlenburg.

"We'd like to work with the community to achieve the best possible outcome for them during this year's harvest, while maintaining our road network when weather permits. Council takes considerable pride in our road infrastructure and maintaining our roads to a high standard."

Mayor Rick Firman reiterated Mr Dahlenburg's thoughts.

"Our councillors and staff are doing their very best given that we are continuing to see consistent rainfall affecting our road network," he said.


