Designing a Future Upgrade of Bradley Park

COUNCIL has received funding from the NSW Government Places to Play Fund for the design of upgrades to Bradley Park. "Bradley Park is located on the northern fringe of Temora bounded by Chiffley Street, Williams Street and Hyde Street," said Council's Town Planner, Claire Golder. "Site inspections by both

the Department of Planning and Environment staff and the design consultants, Place Design Group, along with Council staff, have already taken place," she said. Following these initial meetings, draft concept plans have been prepared. "Community consultation on the draft plans can be

found at www.temora.nsw.gov.au (On Exhibition) or at Council offices. Consultation will close on September 6." The project is intended to support a best practice design process to enable Council to submit a future grant application to fund construction of upgrades of Bradley Park.

Stronger Country Communities Round Five

THE NSW Government's Stronger Country Communities Fund Round Five is open for applications. The Temora Shire Local Government Area (LGA) has a total of \$1,307,085 available for projects under this round of funding. Of this, \$898,621 is available to Council as the applicant with the balance of the allocation open to eligible community organisations. "Projects must be for infrastructure or community programs that boost the wellbeing of regional areas through improved amenity and positive social outcomes," said Council's Town Planner Claire Golder. For example, community amenity projects must be for either:

- construction of new, or
- upgrades to existing, local community infrastructure
- construction of new, or upgrades to existing, local sporting infrastructure
- capital works related to street beautification and other public places that promote the health, happiness and wellbeing of the community
- delivering programs that benefit the local community and provide public benefit
- infrastructure to assist the delivery of general community programs
- infrastructure or community projects or programs which improve and promote accessibility and inclusion.

The minimum grant funding for a project is \$100,000. "Applications for funding

Community Events Program

THE NSW Government's Reconnecting Regional NSW – Community Events Program is a \$25 million initiative aimed at ensuring greater social cohesion and providing an economic boost locally following Covid 19 lockdowns.

Temora Shire Council has received \$239,651 in funding under this scheme allowing for a variety of events to be delivered between August 2022 and March 2023.

"Temora Shire can look forward to festivals, expos, musicals, carnivals, fun days, art exhibitions, workshops and collaborative projects thanks to this initiative," said Event Program Coordinator, Robyn Buerckner.

Ms Buerckner, who is employed by Council throughout the funding period, will facilitate the delivery of the events to ensure funding agreements are met, and the best outcomes for the community are delivered.

"I have enjoyed delivering events in prior roles I've held," she said. "I look forward to supporting community events and rolling out some exciting Council events in the aftermath of Covid-19."

Ms Buerckner lives in Ariah Park with her husband Paul and their two children. Together they run a family farming business in the Ardlethan, Coolamon, Ariah Park, Temora and Bland areas.

"For the last four years I've worked full time as a Business Manager on the farm. Prior to that I worked at the Murrumbidgee & Lachlan Catchment Management Authority and Riverina Local Land Services for 12 years in information and project management," she said.

"I'm excited to be in this role as I have witnessed the progression of our facilities and economic development and I'm proud of Temora Shire. This role will deliver events that celebrate that," she said.

T-Light, at Lake Centenary this Saturday, 27th August, is the first event under the funding to take place.

"T-Light is a winter festival of light, food and fun which promises to be a spectacular celebration on the banks of Lake Centenary," said Ms Buerckner.

"We also have the workshops for our Coo-ee to Marie Exhibition on 27th &

28th August at the Bundawarra Centre, where participants will collaborate to create artworks that will be showcased as part of the exhibition to happen in February 2023," she said.

"The events to be delivered under the funding will appeal to a large demographic and people with a range of interests. There really will be something for everyone."

The Community events Program aims to get people out and about enjoying the local talents and facilities Temora has to offer.

"The events are an opportunity to create connections and allow the community to enjoy everything that's good about Temora," she concluded.

The Reconnecting Regional NSW – Community Events Program is part of the \$200 million Regional Recovery Package, designed to support economic and social recovery across regional NSW that will create new jobs and support community events, shows and festivals to boost tourism.

The \$10.3 million initiative aims to build resilience and improve wellbeing of young people by providing tools and experiences they need to become the best versions of themselves.

"Our UP&UP Hip Hop Music Workshops provide

young people with the opportunity to create original Hip Hop songs," said Temora Youth Program Coordinator, Kassi Owen.

"Participants will explore a theme that is important to the group and will be encouraged to express themselves and their opinion using their own words," she said.

"The young people will write individual and group rhymes. They will use recording equipment, learn microphone techniques, and voice projection skills."


