# WHAT'S NEXT FOR REGIONAL DROUGHT RESILIENCE?

THE Regional Drought Resilience September. Program seeks to understand how residents and businesses beyond the farm gate are impacted by drought and develop communityled strategies that increase our collective resilience to those impacts.

Partners, WSP, have categorised the common themes from the community consultations held in Temora, Ariah Park, West Wyalong and Ungarie in mid-

- The themes were:
- Mental Health Maintaining Social Connection (i.e. Organising activities to get people together, relax and destress)
- Financial Planning (i.e. the who, what, when and how of keeping your small-medium business running through drought / financial downturns)
- Water Access & Supply
- · Economic Diversification including tourism
- **Environment and Land** Management
- Workforce & Traineeships

The Program is moving into its next phase, which means the consultants will be back mid-October with deep-dive workshops into these themes, to focus on developing a priority list of actions to improve the resilience of the community against droughts.

The actions should be developed by the community, for the community, and should have the ability to be implemented at a local and regional level.

WITH Spring quickly heating up, Council would like to remind residents that the clearing of long grass, including vacant blocks, is important and the responsibility of landowners.

"If properties remain unkept, they become a fire hazard and have potential to attract unwanted snakes" said Mr Kris Dunstan,

Director of Environmental Services Failure to comply will result in at Temora Shire Council.

All residents should be aware that when Council receives a complaint about a block of land being a possible fire hazard, the landowner will be notified and given 14 days to respond. If there is no response, they will receive an order to comply within 30 days.
