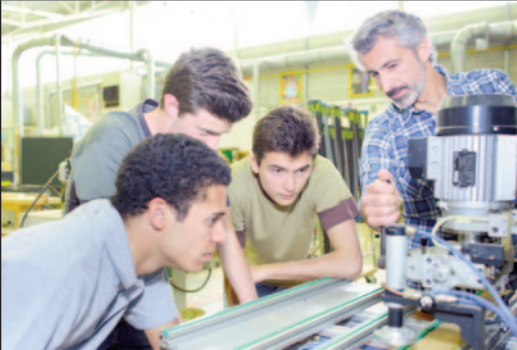


Calling all Tertiary Students

Look Out Before You Step Out

THE 'Look Out Before You Step Out' campaign aims to educate pedestrians to take an extra moment to look before stepping out onto roads, as well as choosing places to cross. Council's Road Safety Officer, Karen Trethowan said "Council is updating the worn decals at refuges, intersections, and crossings to remind pedestrians to look out for oncoming traffic. These stickers serve as a simple reminder to look out before you step out, as it could save your life. They are designed to catch your attention just before you cross the road, especially if you're using a mobile phone, stopping you from walking out into traffic without looking. "It's important to have your head in the moment and make safe decisions with crossing the road. With the increase in technology use we are becoming more distracted and less aware of our surroundings," Karen said.

Key Safety Tips For Crossing The Road

- Never assume that an approaching vehicle can see you or will stop for you – wait until all vehicles have stopped before you step off the kerb.
- Look before you cross. Just because someone else decides to cross, doesn't mean it's safe for you.
- Avoid crossing between parked cars or at the front or back of buses and large vehicles.
- At intersections, check for turning vehicles before you leave the kerb, and while you are crossing the road.
- Always use pedestrian crossings or other pedestrian facilities where possible.
- Unplug your earphones and put away your phone.

How Do Land Values Impact Your Rates?

TEMORA Shire ratepayers received a Notice of Valuation from the Valuer General earlier this month showing the unimproved land value as at 01/07/2022. Valuations in the Shire increased by 103% overall when compared with 01/07/2019 as depicted in the following table. (Please note: This is an overall movement, an individual property may have increased by more or less than the following average movements).

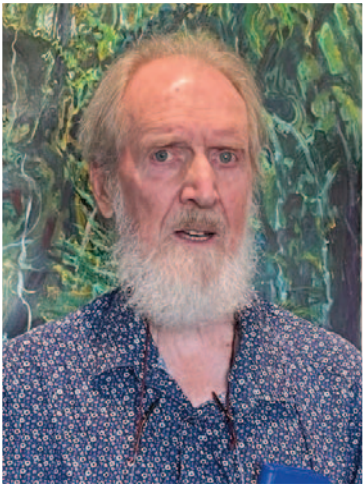

Under certain circumstances a ratepayer can object to the valuation given by the Valuer General within 60 days of the date of the Notice of Valuation. More information can be found by calling the office of the Valuer General on 1800 110 038 or on the Valuer Generals website - www.valuergeneral.nsw.gov.au Council uses these valuations to calculate rates for the next 3 years, commencing the year ended 30/06/2024, however it is important for ratepayers to understand that an overall increase in land values of 103% does not equate to an increase of 103% in Council's general income from rates. The Independent Pricing and Regulatory Tribunal (IPART) determines the maximum limit to which Council's general income from rates can increase each year, this is known as the rate peg. Temora Shire Council's rate peg for the year ending 30/06/2024 is 3.7%. To keep increases below or at the 3.7% peg rate, Council adjusts the base rate (and/or rate in the dollar) that is used to multiply the property's valuation. So, if a property value significantly increases there would be a decrease in the base rate.

Celebrating David

THE "Celebrating David" exhibition offers a rare insight into the life and art of Temora's own David Schlunke, an internationally recognised, award-winning artist whose thought-provoking creativity extends well beyond the canvas. Having long recognised the value of recording the stories of its residents, Temora Shire Heritage Committee seized the opportunity of funding provided by the Reconnecting Regional NSW Community Events Program to engage Mr Rob Willis OAM, a well-known Oral Historian, to record David's story and link it to an exhibition graciously provided by the artist. From a very extensive series of interviews, Mr Willis distilled a twenty-minute video encapsulating David's early life and his evolution as an artist, graphic philosopher, and environmental conservationist. To this he added a virtual gallery of thirteen of David's paintings, matched to audio that provides insights into each piece from the artist himself. Seventeen original works, spanning forty-five productive years, complete the exhibition. Mr Willis describes David as "a self-effacing, fascinating and inspiring human, he's one of the most interesting people I have recorded in my 40 years of interviewing who is now a close friend". Presented as one of the flagship events of Temora's "Drench Festival", "Celebrating David" does indeed, offer "a healthy dose of culture". 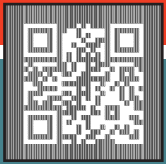

EMBRACE Festival

ON Sunday 2nd April, Temora Shire Council in conjunction with the Temora Community Centre, will be hosting an inaugural multicultural celebration, the Embrace Festival, at Temora's Railway Precinct from 11am – 2pm.

Free to all members of the community, the Embrace Festival promotes cultural awareness and appreciation through interactive performances and workshops. The packed schedule includes an Aboriginal Smoking Ceremony, Korean calligraphy workshops, and traditional Indian music.

The event will feature regional performers from the Chinese Prosperous Lion Dance Association, Yuluug Cultural Programs, Coota Bollywood All Stars, a trio from Melbourne Tabla School, Dizzy Dilemma, and many talented local performers. There will be plenty of entertainment for people of all ages.
