

BITUMEN RESURFACING PROGRAM IN 2024



TEMORA Shire Council will be undertaking our bitumen resurfacing works during late February / early March on MR84 Burley Griffin Way and MR57 Goldfields Way as a sub-contractor to Transport for NSW (TfNSW).

These works will also incorporate bitumen resealing of the following Temora urban streets and facilities.

State Road Reseals

- Goldfields Way – Sebastopol Area (between Shire boundary and Sebastopol)

- Goldfields Way – Barmedman Area (southern edge of Barmedman)
- Burley Griffin Way – Polaris Street to Briar St/Alora Ag grain site entrance

Urban Street Reseals Temora

- Camp St (between Polaris St and Britannia St)
- Clarke St (entire length)
- John Rands Place (entire length)
- Kitchener Rd (level crossing to Hoskins St)
- Little Bellevue St (entire length)
- Little Camp St (entire sealed length)
- Little DeBoos St (Britannia St to the southern end)
- Macauley Street (Junee Rd to end kerb)
- Oak Street (entire length)
- Thom St (entire sealed length)
- Truskett St (entire sealed length)
- Cootamundra Rd (intersection of Austral St and Cootamundra Rd)
- Nicholson St

(entire length)

Urban Facilities

- Lake Centenary – entrance road, carpark roads, parking areas, and boat ramp area
- Temora Cemetery – main access road and parking area between lawn cemetery and old monumental cemetery

Weather permitting, this process will take approximately two weeks to complete, with some preparation works being undertaken prior to resealing where required.

Some minor inconvenience may occur.

Following bitumen resurfacing, existing linemarking will be reinstated.

Council apologises for any inconvenience and wishes to offer thanks for public cooperation throughout this process.

Road re-surfacing will be undertaken in many Temora Streets throughout 2024.

bring a drink. Council will be supplying the bags and will pick up the waste from your allocated/nominated location.

Live Traffic NSW

KNOWING about road closures can keep people safe and save lives.

Live Traffic NSW is a website and app that provides real time information about incidents and changed traffic conditions that may affect your journey. The website can be directly accessed from Council's homepage; temora.nsw.gov.au

The aim is to help drivers make the best possible travel decisions to help the safe and efficient management of roads across NSW.

State road information on Live traffic NSW is managed by the Transport Management Centre (TMC). The TMC monitors and manages the 18,000 NSW state road network 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

The TMC works closely with other government agencies and service providers, including Temora Shire Council, to maximise the safety and efficiency

of the NSW State road network. Other agencies include: NSW Police, Fire and Rescue NSW, NSW Ambulance, State Emergency Service, Rural Fire Service and other Local Government Authorities. Temora Shire Council can now communicate disruptions to roads in our Shire in real time, which is particularly important during emergencies, such as vehicle accidents, flooding and fires. Federal Park and Bradley Park to be upgraded

THROUGHOUT 2024 Federal Park in the Railway Precinct and Bradley Park on Chiefly Street will be upgraded as part of Councils strategy to improve playground quality and diversity through the renewal of existing playgrounds.

Demolition works to remove the existing Federal Park equipment

is underway, and the construction of the new equipment is scheduled to commence in early March, weather permitting. Somewhere Landscape Architects are finalising the landscape design for the consideration of Council.

Council has also engaged Creative Outdoors and More,

based in Wagga Wagga, to deliver stage one of the upgrade to Bradley Park. Stage one will include construction of accessible paths, additional play features, landscaped areas, and an accessible toilet.

As outlined in Council's Temora Community Strategic Plan (February 2022) the

longterm vision for Council is "to enhance the quality of life for its community members where people with disabilities and their families are able to live, work and play"

Both projects are anticipated to be completed by 30 June 2024.

Prior to taking up a new role in Sydney, Mr Bulkeley will assist in the handover to ensure a smooth and seamless transition.

"I am grateful to Andrew for agreeing to remain with the organisation while I settle into the role and obtain a deeper understanding of the research and development programs at FarmLink, as well as the opportunities that lie ahead," Mr Morgan said.

"I look forward to working with the local Temora community, the Temora Shire Council and the team at FarmLink to grow agricultural innovation and investment in the region."

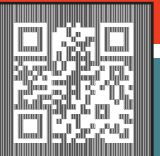
