HOSKINS STREET ROAD UPGRADE WE'VE BEEN WAITING FOR

ON behalf of Transport for NSW, Temora Shire Council is upgrading a 1.4-kilometre section of Hoskins Street in Temora. Upgrades include removing old road surface and laying a stronger and smoother road surface. To limit the impacts to motorists, businesses and residents, the project will be carried out in

"This is a mighty task ahead of Council, staff, and the community - which will inevitably end in a positive result for all road users," explains Mayor Rick Firman.

"Recently Council was contracted by Transport for NSW to patch Hoskins Street, in particular, near the Grey Street intersection. These

were temporary fixes to get us through a busier than usual time on our roads - harvest. These new works are different, as they will last us another 50

Stage one, Part One will commence Monday 11th March on Hoskins Street, between Victoria and Britannia Streets. It will take approximately two weeks to complete, weather permitting. The works will be day works between the hours of 7am and 6pm.

Hoskins Street will be closed to motorists during the day for two weeks, from 11 March, between Victoria and Britannia Street. Detours will be implemented via Austral Street, Baker Street and

Victoria Street.

"There will be no street parking in front of the Medical Complex, however we understand this is an essential service and therefore we've ensured access to the car park will remain open from Austral Street end of Hoskins Street," explains Mayor Firman.

'Another essential service is Temora & District Funeral Service, we want to reassure the community street parking will remain open in front of this service – again accessible at the Austral Street end of Hoskins.'

Access to parking in Britannia Street is available off Baker and Deboos Streets for Temora Library, Pinnacle Services and other businesses

in Hoskins Street near this location.

Stage one, Part Two is expected to commence immediately after stage one (approximately Monday 25

March) on Hoskins Street between Kitchener Road and Polaris Street. These works will take approximately four weeks during the day (between 7am and 6pm), weather permitting.

'These works will be different to stage one, which will be closed completely during day works. During stage two works, Hoskins Street will remain open with single lane closures during the day. Reduced speed limits and traffic control will be in place to direct traffic" explains

Mayor Firman.

"Both stages will reopen to traffic at night. Council suggest, if you are travelling through Hoskins Street - and not stopping, you reroute your journey to avoid delays.'

"Remember this is a shortterm inconvenience for a very long-term gain, that we've all been asking for. We appreciate the community's patience while we undertake these works safely" concluded Mayor Firman.

Note: These works will not include a roundabout installation at Polaris Street intersection, Hoskins Street footpath upgrades, or Heavy Vehicle by-pass. These projects are subject to further investigation and/or funding.

Trees to be replenished near Ariah Park entrance

A line of small scraggly gum trees will be replaced on Burley Griffin Way between Garvins Lane intersection and Mary Gilmore Way, just before the turn off to Ariah Park (coming from Temora).

"The small gums on the northern side of the highway will be replaced with a more suitable species of tree to our geographical location and weather conditions, which will thrive in our shire's environment. The original trees just didn't take off and have really struggled," explained Mayor Rick Firman of the decision to replace the trees.

"This line of new trees will be planted closer to the property boundary than the current trees. This will assist in keeping our road users safe if trees drop limbs.'

Council is looking to improve and maintain the entrance to Ariah Park, by keeping it tidy with regular slashing. This slashing work is currently unachievable due to current gum tree variety planted along the northern side of the road which never grew properly, with low branches and canopies.

"Councillor Nigel Judd, who is the adjoining landowner, recalled that it was his father, Arnold Judd, who initiated the idea of the avenue of trees on this open stretch of road, which came about after Ariah Park was by-passed in 1961. The trees were planted in 1975 and 1976," Mayor Firman revealed.

"As we know, the Ironbark trees on the southern side have done well, but the pink flowering yellow gums on the northern side have been patchy at best. We found the same problem in the tree lines we planted on our adjacent farm," explain Cr Judd.

northern side are sitting on the main water pipeline from Thanowring Road to the reservoirs at Ariah Park," said Mayor Firman. The roadside shoulders and table drain

"Further to this, the present trees on the

need maintenance due to recent natural disasters. Goldenfields Water County Council are about to renew this pipeline, moving it to inside the Judd's fence line. To initiate works, vegetation works need to be carried out first.

"It would make sense if the two projects could be done at the same time, as they may need to remove some trees to do the works anyhow," explains Cr Judd.

"Helen and I are committed to caring for the trees in their early years, to ensure they not only survive, but thrive" concluded Cr Judd.

The replacement plan has been assessed and approved by an environmental Step 2 Memo in accordance with the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979 issued to Temora Shire Council by the environmental team at Transport for NSW.
