# Captured in time for future generations

IN January 2023, Catalyst Accountants and Financial Solutions owner, Grea Durham, embarked on a love project, to restore the corner of brick, in that it was 'bringing Loftus Street (between Little Baker Street) and around onto Hoskins Street.

Durham purchased the property in 2003, which now holds Catalyst Accountants, Sadie Michael Fashions, The Studio, and Temora Travel. Twenty years later, it was time to give the external façade a make-over, bringing to life the 1920s Art Deco style of vestervear

Katie Keith Designs (KKD) was employed to take on the challenge.

"One of the most noticeable changes is that of the blue tile which is a modern interpretation of a traditional glazed subway tile," said Katie Keith, owner of KKD.

This corner of Hoskins St lies within Temora's Heritage Precinct, meaning KKD worked closely with the Heritage Committee, whose aim is to protect and conserve areas and items of historic heritage value

the layers of past generations, we had many comments from the public about the exposed back memories.' Greg and I met again to discuss leaving a section of the bricks untiled, which we have done." Katie said.

"It is important that the communities voice was considered in the design, as we hope that it is here for many generations to enjoy,"

From the interior of Catalyst scattered with old pictures of our town, it is obvious Greg has a passion for heritage and engenders greater interest and preservation. This project was more than just the right tile, it looked at all elements of the building's exterior including the exterior colour scheme, the restoration of the existing leadlight windows, awnings, and parapet walls above. The inspiration for the overall scheme came from the colours interested in finding out used in the original leadlight windows.

"We wanted to rejuvenate the existing exterior to reflect the vibrant and modern

"Once we started to pull back business's that call it home, whilst paying tribute, and being sympathetic to the buildings heritage and the main streets history." Katie explained.

"We'd like to acknowledge the skills of the local trades who contributed to what are commonly known as 'lost arts'. The reinstatement of the Monel windows and the reconstruction and reinstatement of the coloured glass and headlight windows which had lain concealed for decades have all been revelations," said Council's Heritage Advisor, David Scobie.



### **Territories Stolen Generations Redress Scheme**

SHARING or reading this information might bring up difficult memories and feelings. If you need help managing the emotional impacts of this information. Call 13YARN (13 92 76).

Stolen Generations survivors who were removed as children from their families and or communities in the Northern Territory or the Australian Capital Territory (before self-government) or the Jervis Bay Territory, can now apply for redress.

People can apply to the www.territoriesredress.gov. au in their own time until 28 February 2026.

The Scheme offers a redress payment of up to \$75,000 and a healing assistance payment of \$7,000. The Scheme also offers the opportunity for Stolen Generations survivors to have their story services

about the impact of their removal acknowledged by a senior government official, should they wish, and have it acknowledged in a written and/or face-to-face way.

Applicants do not need to have records about their removal to apply but may wish to share any documentation.

Free support services


are available to help applicants throughout the application process - they can access these services even if they are just thinking about applying. The Scheme encourages applicants to contact these services to help them make a fully informed decision that best suits their personal situation.


Support to submit applications is available through local Link Up

Independent legal advice and financial counselling in relation to applications is available through knowmore Legal Service (www.knowmore.org.au). knowmore has culturally safe, trauma-informed assistance on 1800 566 966 or 1800KNOWMORE. They have male and female Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Engagement Advisors available in all of their offices.

If a member of the Stolen Generations passes away on or after the Scheme was announced on 5 August 2021 and they would have met the eligibility criteria, their family can apply on their behalf




