This self-drive adventure encourages you to explore and wander at your own pace. There are numerous sights to see and tastes to enjoy along the trail.

LOCAL Government Election will be held from 8am - 6pm on Saturday 14th September at Temora Memorial Town Hall, Ariah Park Hall, and St John's Lutheran Church Hall, Temora.

You are eligible to apply for a postal vote if you will be unable to attend a polling place on election day during voting hours (8am - 6pm)

If you have access to the internet, this is the most efficient way to apply for a postal vote. You may also contact the call centre on 1300 135 736 and have a call centre operator

complete an online application on your behalf.

Note: If you are a registered general postal voter, you do not need to apply.

Pre-poll voting

If you would like to vote in person but you are unable to get to a voting centre on election day, you may be eligible to vote early at the Temora Memorial Town Hall. Check the criteria and attend on the below available times:

- Saturday 7 Sept: 9am 6pm,
- · Sunday 8 Sept: closed,
- Monday 9 Sept Wednesday 11 Sept: 8.30am - 5.30pm,

- Thursday 12 Sept: 8.30am -8pm.
- Friday 13 Sept: 8.30am -6pm.

Telephone assisted voting for the local election on 14 September is only available to people who are blind or have low vision.

Call the Telephone Voting application call centre on 1300 135 736 to apply, declaring to the operator that you are eligible to cast this type of vote.

Applications for telephone assisted voting close at 6pm on Friday, 13 September.

A chance to have your say on the future of Temora Shire

THE Temora Shire Council's Community Satisfaction Survey will be released on 16th September, for residents to have their say.

The survey will be coordinated by an independent research organisation CATALYSE. CATALYSE will assess our community wellbeing and quality of life, achievements aligned to Council's vision and community aspirations, and overall satisfaction of Council's performance, activities, services, and facilities.

The survey will also determine community priorities, suggesting areas for improvement and will seek feedback regarding how Council communicates and engages with the community.

"This survey comes at a strategic time, as we move from one term of Council to another. It is an opportunity for our community to tell us what we've done well and they are currently satisfied with, and where our community would like us to focus resources in the future," said Council's General Manager Ms Melissa Boxall.

Temora Shire residents aged 14 years or older will be asked to complete the survey.

"We're striving to have responses

from 10% of the population, with a good cross-section of ages, gender and location," Ms Boxall said.

The survey will come to residents in many ways, such as Australia Post distribution direct to your mailbox, emails from CATALYSE (independent research organisation), and QR codes in posters and social media.

"Keep an eye out for the survey from the many channels CATALYSE will send it out from. You only need to do it once and we really appreciate the community providing us with this much valued feedback! Ms Boxall said..

On Exhibition - airport usage fees, arts and floodplain risk management

IN the last Council meeting for the term, three documents were progressed through to public consultation for Temora Shire residents to review. Documents include:

Draft Airport Usage Fees Policy - manage ongoing maintenance Temora Airport by requiring commercial operators and event organisers to contribute to the cost of repairing and maintaining airport infrastructure; Requiring a financial contribution from those residents of the Temora Airpark Estate; Linking this policy to Council's annual operational plan and budget, delivery plan and asset management plan; and linking this policy to the Temora Airport Master Plan and the Event

Management Application Policy. **Draft Art Acquisition,** Management and **Decommissioning Policy -**

includes new references to public art and proposes the establishment of the Temora Shire Art Acquisition Advisory Committee.

Draft Temora Floodplain Risk Management Study and Plan - provides comprehensive mapping of a range of flood scenarios and recommendations for future actions to mitigate against the impacts of flooding in Temora, including construction of stormwater detention basins, investigation of flood warning systems, community education, vegetation management and planning controls through Council's Development Control

Rec Centre entering a new chapter

SINCE the appointment of the new Recreation Centre Manager, Angela Guilfoyle, in December 2023, there has been a renewed focus on increasing patronage, utilisation of all facilities and improving the financial bottom line. In only six months of operation the Centre has had an approximate \$21,000 improvement on previous years.

Learn to Swim lessons are currently servicing 134 students for Term 3, which is likely to increase to 200 in Term 4 in time for Summer. These lessons have helped the indoor swimming pool become an income positive asset, turning a \$23,925 deficit in 2022/23 financial year to a \$48,189 profit in 2023/24.

"This is promising for the future, as

Council's lessons only commenced in February 2024. Therefore, we expect an even greater return in the 2024/25 financial year," said Mr Kris Dunstan, Council's Director of Environmental Services.

The indoor pool activities also now include three weekly Aqua Aerobics classes. Attendance is expected to increase significantly as the warmer months are here.

"Energy costs have also decreased since swapping the indoor pool's gas heating for electric heat pump, which means we can run from solar," explained Mr Dunstan.

In April 2024 the Rec Centre introduced the fastest growing sport in Australia, Pickleball. Come and Try days have been a hit, with 50

participants currently registered. From July, Council purchased

second-hand studio equipment and is now utilising the upstairs function room for Group Fitness Sessions, which includes the famous Les Mills BodyPump.

"The establishment and operating costs were expected to be returned within 12 months; however it is already proving more successful than first thought," Mr Dunstan said.

The outdoor pool will open for summer on Friday 25th October, and early morning lap swimming commences Monday 4th November.

Future of Ag on show - Farmlink Open Day

ON Friday 13th of September, FarmLink Research will welcome growers, producers and advisors back to the Temora Agricultural Innovation Centre for their annual Open Day. This year's Open Day is a great opportunity to keep up to date with the latest research and see cutting edge technology in action with a demonstration of the SwarmFarm Robotics sprayer

FarmLink is a not-forprofit research organisation focused on extending the latest R&D and technology to its member base of southern NSW growers, consultants and other industry members. The Open Day is a chance for farmer members and nonmembers to catch up with familiar faces and take in relevant, local agricultural research and development.

"FarmLink was formed in 2004 to undertake pivotal research, development and work more extensively on extension that is directly

relevant to our members and farmers generally. Open Day highlights the innovative trials that will help increase the profitability of their farming enterprises", said FarmLink CEO, Shaughn Morgan.

This year, an impressive line-up of industry experts will be on hand to discuss the latest research on topics as diverse as cropping disease, mixed species fodder crops, climate projections, 100day wheat, carbon farming nitrogen risk management (RiskWi\$e); the potential of green ammonia; long coleoptile (deep sown) wheat; and more.

A much-anticipated highlight of the day will be the opening of the GRDCfunded Agri-Innovation Laboratory.

Designed to efficiently process plant and soil samples, the new infrastructure will enable FarmLink researchers to
