Looking Back at 2024

AS the clock ticked over to 2025, Temora Shire Council took a moment to reflect on the achievements and contributions made throughout the past year.

"Serving a community of over 6,000 residents and nearly 3,000 households, the staff and volunteer efforts in 2024 were nothing short of remarkable," said Mayor Rick Firman.

In 2024, Council employed 190 dedicated staff members, managing an impressive \$75 million operating and capital budget. The Council also oversaw assets valued at over \$387 million, including upgrades and renewals. These assets encompassed:

• 1,334 km of roads (equivalent to a trip

from Temora to Hervey Bay), with 8 bridges and 24 bridge-sized culverts

- 24 km of footpaths
- 12 parks, plus 2 off-leash dog parks
- 1 community garden
- 4,851 street trees
- 3 caravan parks
- 4 cemeteries
- 10 sporting facilities, plus one group fitness centre
- 2 aquatic centres
- 1 lake with 48.6 hectares of water and 15 hectares of greenlands
- 3 waste management facilities
- 1 sewerage treatment plant with 60 km of sewerage pipeline and 8.6 km of drainage pipeline
- 1 airport with 5 runways (330 sq.m of

- taxiway, apron, and runway)
- · 2 aeroclub facilities
- 5 museums and cultural centres

· 2 community halls

Temora Shire Council were acknowledged in their efforts in several achievements in 2024, including:

- Champion Employer Award from Multicultural NSW
- Temora Shire Library received Innovation in Outreach Services for their Intergenerational Preschool program
- Temora Town Hall Theatre volunteer, Beth Firman was recognised with Inclusion to the Hidden Treasures NSW Honour Roll
- Council was successful in progressing to the final of the Rural Management

Challenge, being held in Sydney late February 2025

- Council staff were successful in receiving over \$4 million in grant funding
- · Completed upgrade works and reopened facilities at Federal Park, Bradley Park, Nixon Park, Tara-Bectric Road, and Stage One of Hoskins Street Road upgrade

In the January 2025 Council meeting, Council noted thank you letters they received from Sacred Heart Parish for use of Callaghan Park and mobile stage for Christmas Eve Mass, Temora Christian Leaders for use of Gloucester Park, mobile stage and main street banner, and Mayor of Izumizaki for our gift commemorating 35 years of friendship as a Sister City.

Throughout 2024, Council also provided funding and support to various community groups, enhancing the vibrancy and connectivity of the Shire. Some of these initiatives included the Hilltop Appeal for a Cancer Patient and Carer Accommodation Centre, Carols in the Park, Christmas Eve Mass, school end of year presentation days, Bush Bursary Program, Temora Town Hall Theatre, Verandah Reinstatement Fund, Temora Show, International Women's Day, V8 Jetboats, Ariah Park Show, A Country Weekend (Regency Ramblers) Hot Rod Run, ANZAC Day, Remembrance Day, DRENCH, Ariah Park Light Show, Embrace Festival, Temora Recreation Centre and Ariah Park Pool.

Temora and Bland Councils Secure Major Funding to Boost Drought Resilience

TEMORA Shire Council (TSC) and Bland Shire Council (BSC) are proud to announce their successful partnership in securing \$341,660 in funding for the implementation of six key activities under the Regional Drought Resilience Planning (RDRP) Program.

This funding, provided by the NSW Department of Primary Industries & Regional Development as part of the Federal Government's Future Drought Fund, will enhance drought preparedness, improve infrastructure, and strengthen social and economic resilience across both shires.

Key Activities to Benefit Both Communities

The six funded projects include:

- **Bringing Vacant Houses onto the** Rental Market: Addressing housing shortages to attract and retain skilled
- Spend Data Analysis: Providing real-time economic data to inform business and community decisions.
- **HR Management Support Scoping:** Enhancing workforce resilience and creating employment pathways for local youth.
- **Strengthening Community Groups:** Engaging a volunteer coordinator to build social cohesion and support community organisations.
- **Expanding the Resilience Project:** Extending mental health and resilience training to schools and the wider community.
- · Improving Water Efficiency: Evaluating irrigation systems to preserve green spaces and enhance environmental outcomes.

A Strong Partnership for Resilient Communities

"This partnership demonstrates further how working together can achieve meaningful outcomes for our Shire residents," said Temora Shire Council Mayor Rick Firman. "By combining our resources and expertise - where appropriate - we can tackle

shared challenges more effectively."

Mayor Firman's sentiments were echoed by Cr Brian Monaghan, Mayor of Bland Shire Council, who said, "This funding will make a tangible difference in our communities, from boosting local economies to improving social cohesion and environmental resilience.

Next Steps

Work on these projects will commence immediately, with completion expected by November 2025. Both councils are committed to keeping the community informed and ensuring the funding delivers maximum benefits.




